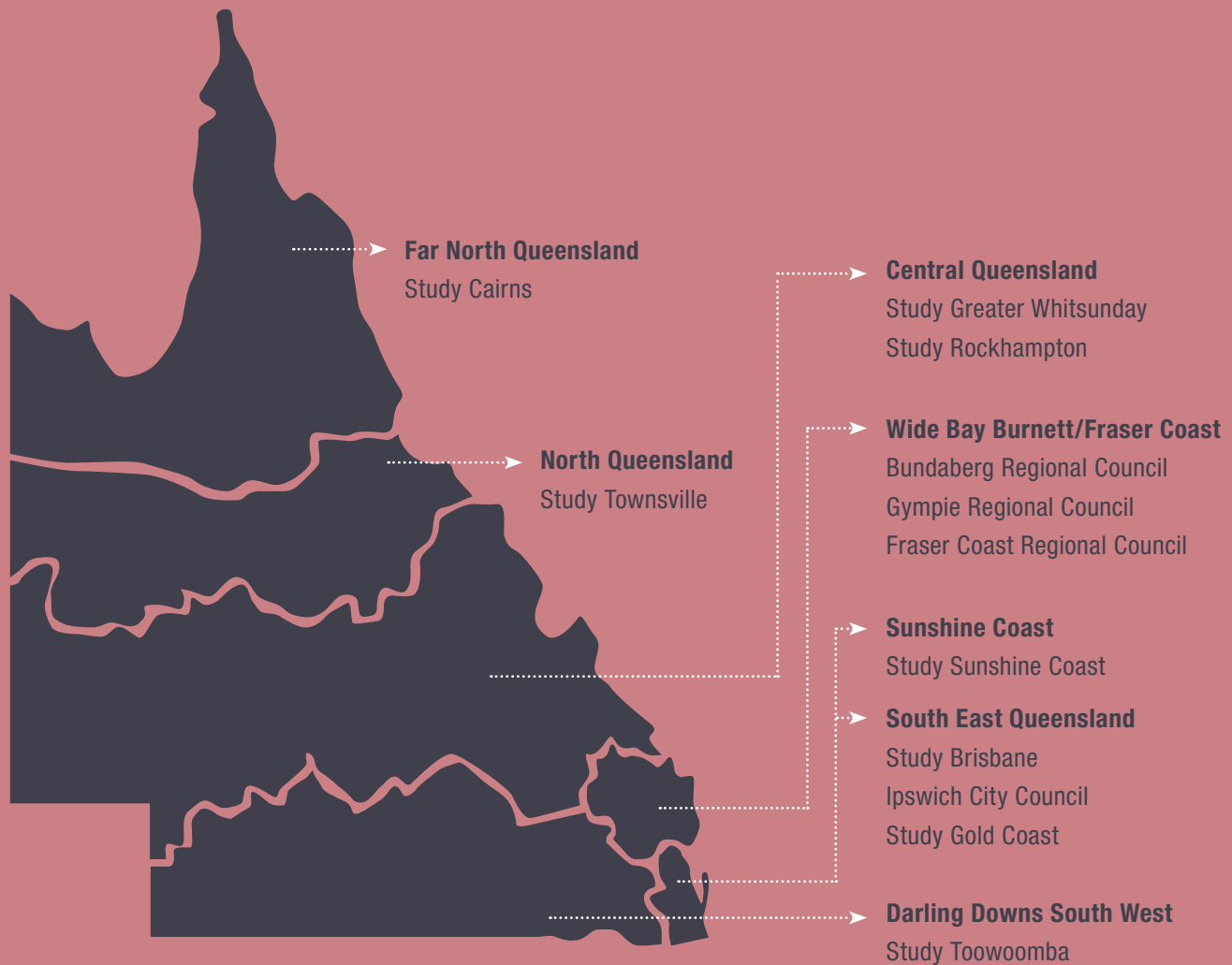

Why study in Queensland, Australia

Queensland is a place of great opportunity where people from all over the world are able to bring to life their dreams of success - in their studies and their career.

Queensland's world-class education and training institutions, safe, multicultural communities, idyllic locations, and enviable lifestyle make it the location of choice for many international students.

The Queensland Government is dedicated to welcoming, valuing and supporting students through partnerships with the education and training industry to create exciting initiatives to ensure every student is receiving the support and opportunity they need to achieve their study and career goals.

Queensland Student Hub Network

Providing virtual and in-person support for students across Queensland the Queensland Student Hub network gives students access to information, personal support sessions, workshops and advice at every stage of their journey.

Services include: connection to local events and social activities, orientation to Australia and accommodation advice, career pathways advice, cultural and religious support, individual assistance relating to mental health and wellbeing, safety and security support, referrals to financial and legal support, work experience and employment advice, volunteering opportunities and English language support.

1800QSTUDY is Queensland's student hotline providing phone support and information related to studying in Queensland. The hotline is available 24/7 and free when calling from an Australian landline or mobile provider so students will always have access to support when studying in Queensland. Family members, legal guardians, agents or other persons may also call the service regarding issues concerning studying in Queensland. The hotline offers accredited translation and interpreter services for most languages free of charge.

Services include: after hours support, accommodation advice, public transport and travel advice, employment advice, health and wellbeing referrals, legal referrals and complaint referrals.

Each region has its own distinctive features and opportunities, and all have a strong sense of community and cultural inclusivity. While each region is different, they share a reputation as some of the world's most welcoming and rewarding study destinations. Brisbane is ranked in the top 20 best student cities globally. It is home to three major universities and nearly 100,000 students who can enjoy a cosmopolitan lifestyle. The city is teeming with creativity and boasts impressive late-night offerings and a thriving arts and music scene.

A short drive south and you will reach the Gold Coast where students experience the best of both worlds with a modern urban centre and nearby subtropical rainforests. Head north from Brisbane and you will find the Sunshine Coast, with Cairns, Townsville, Mackay and Greater Whitsunday, and Rockhampton, all connected by the Great Barrier Reef stretching 2,300km along the coast. These regions are home to vibrant student communities who enjoy rewarding study opportunities and an ideal Australian lifestyle.



Brisbane

Brisbane is the capital of Queensland and home to more than 85,000 international students. Brisbane's world-ranking universities and education institutes offer programs for all levels of study across various subjects as well as college and English language courses.

With a population of more than two million, Brisbane is Australia's fastest-growing capital city for employment and offers a great range of opportunities in both the public and private sectors.

Brisbane is the perfect place to call home while you study abroad. Aside from the low cost of living and 283 days of sunshine per year, Brisbane is a warm and welcoming city, hosting the Lord Mayor's International Student Friendship Ceremony which has extended the hand of friendship to more than 10,000 students.



Gold Coast

Located on the edge of the Asia-Pacific rim, with access to two international airports, the Gold Coast is perfectly positioned as a destination for study and vocational training, research, careers and employment. With over 200 world class education and training providers including three universities and TAFE Queensland, the Gold Coast is Queensland's second most populous city and an emerging global city home to students from more than 130 nationalities.

Employability is a big focus for the Gold Coast that is home to a diverse range of industries including health, tourism, construction, film and television and professional services. The Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct (GCHKP) is an emerging health

and innovation hub for the Asia-Pacific region with state-of-the-art medical, research and training facilities creating an integrated and collaborative location for learning, research, knowledge creation and the commercialisation of newly developed technologies. Ipswich

Located 45 minutes southwest from Brisbane, Ipswich is home to 11 schools, the University of Southern Queensland, TAFE Queensland, an English language college and a variety of other education providers.

Graduates from the University of Southern Queensland have the highest starting salary in Australia according to the Good Universities Guide 2020, and many faculties within the university report the proportion of graduates entering employment soon after graduation is much higher than the national and state averages.

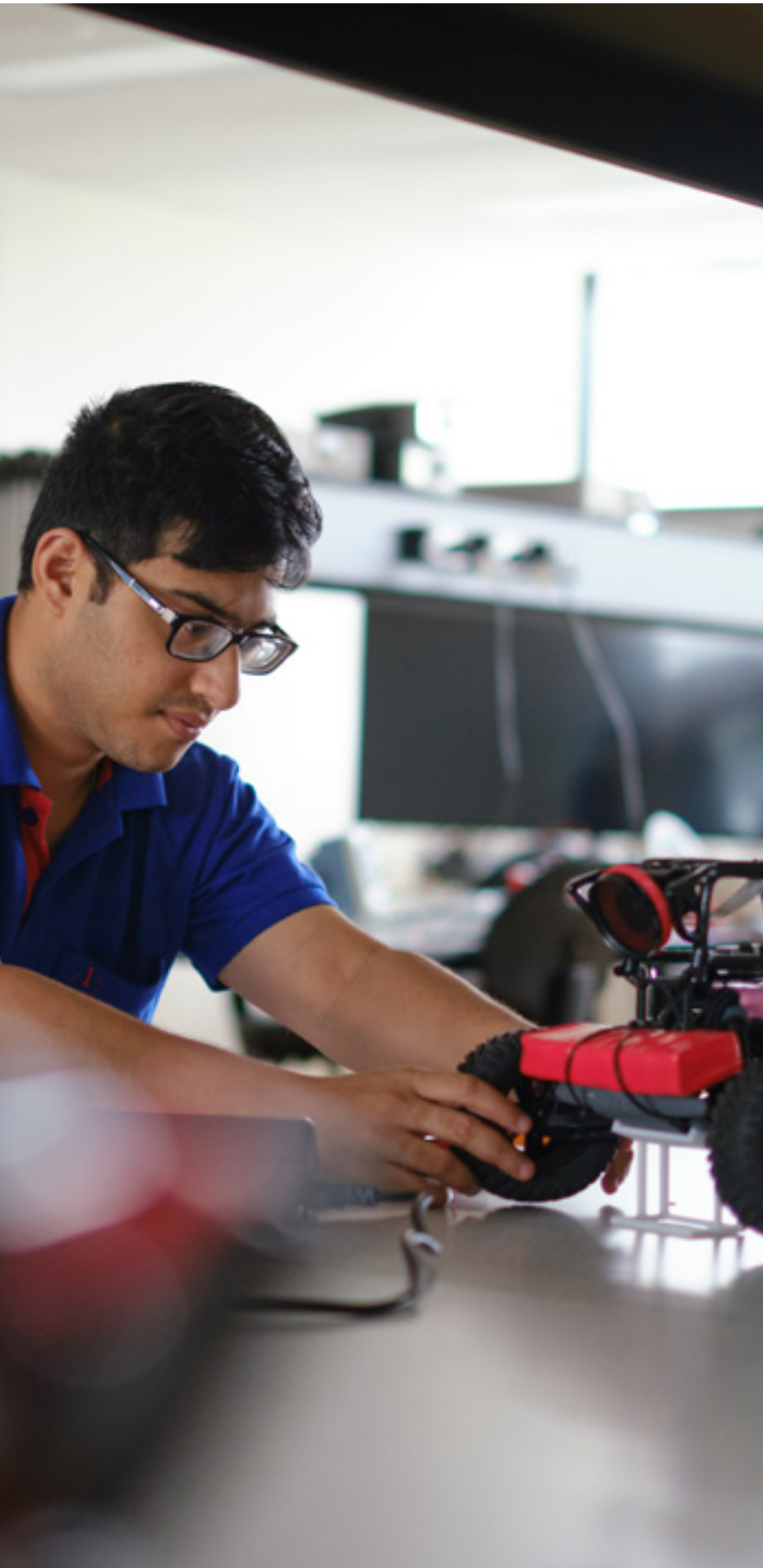

The region's universities have been acknowledged as world-class by independent body 'Excellence in Research for Australia'.

Rockhampton's Institute for Future Farming Systems is a leading centre for AgTech innovation and is internationally recognised for specialist skills. Researchers are also influencing the development of high speed and heavy haul rail technology all around the world. The region is a key partner in the Joint Laboratory on Railway Engineering – an international initiative with universities in China, Italy and the Netherlands.



Townsville

The Townsville region offers students access to a wide variety of extraordinary environments, experiences and work and study opportunities without needing to travel far from the city.

World-renowned for its natural wonders, Townsville has a unique mix of reef, rainforest, islands and outback all within 45 minutes of the city centre – a combination that does not exist elsewhere in Australia.

The incredible environmental diversity of the region makes Townsville an unmatched place to study specialised disciplines such as tropical sciences or tropical medicine, marine science, botany, biology or biodiversity, tropical agriculture and aquaculture.

Townsville is a marine and climate knowledge hub, being the home of the headquarters of Australia's major marine research and management authorities: The Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority, The Australian Institute of Marine Science, and the Australian Bureau of Meteorology.

As the largest city in northern Australia, Townsville is a major hub for mining and resources, agriculture, construction, manufacturing, healthcare, government, defence and more. Townsville's rich variety of industries means that the local economy is diverse, with leading companies who are able to provide students access to jobs, work experience and placement opportunities.

Townsville has a large urban indigenous population who are actively involved in the cultural life of the region, and whose vast knowledge and experience informs unique programs such as indigenous studies and tropical medicine.



Cairns

Dive deeper into life and learning.

Located on the coast of far north Queensland, Cairns offers international students a huge variety of opportunities to learn, grow and experience life in Australia. The options are limitless.

Cairns is a leading hub for coastal and tropical science and environmental studies and is home to the finest outdoor classroom in the world. With a tropical environment unlike anywhere else in the world - reefs, rainforests, significant coastal, mountain and outback ecosystems, and indigenous centres - students can apply their learnings and gain practical experience in inspiring and remarkable environments.

Classroom on the Reef – learn about climate change, rising sea levels, and how this impacts the coral reefs and marine ecosystems. Run by James Cook University, Classroom on the Reef give high school students the opportunity to gain life-changing practical experience by learning within a world heritage-listed marine park.

Classroom in the Rainforest – the Daintree Rainforest Observatory brings science lessons to life with students having the opportunity to learn and research in a unique setting often described as the ‘Classroom in the Rainforest’.

Cairns is a smaller, more connected community than the cities. Educators, industry and government work together to shape a positive student experience by connecting education providers and industry to help students gain work experience and employability skills.

The Study Cairns ‘Connects’ Employability program helps government and businesses work directly with education providers to give students employability training and enhance their employment prospects.

The Cairns Student Hub offers free employability workshops, English language lessons and safe and welcoming space for students to meet friends and access advice and support.

Living in Queensland

Accommodation

The cost of accommodation in Queensland is relatively affordable compared with other states in Australia. Queensland offers a variety of accommodation options to suit most student budgets.

In general, students live in either home-stay accommodation with an Australian family or rental accommodation with other students. Student accommodation is available at some education institutions. Contact your chosen study institution for more information if you are interested in this option.

- **Student Accommodation** - Student accommodation can be an excellent way to learn about Australian culture from locals. It is also a great opportunity to improve your English language skills.
- **Homestay** - Homestays give you the opportunity to experience life as part of a Queensland family. They are an excellent way to learn about Australian culture and to improve your English language skills. Most education institutions in Queensland will arrange homestays for students on request.
- **Rental Accommodation** - Rental accommodation in Queensland varies from small studio apartments to large houses, which are normally rented by a number of tenants living together as “housemates”.

Queensland offers a range of work options for students where they can gain practical experience and prepare for their future. Options include:

Transport

Getting in and around the cities of Queensland is easy and affordable. Many transport options including public transport, bicycle, car, and flights are available in Queensland for both short-distance and long-distance travel to help you enjoy the vibrant community and diverse environment of Queensland.

Public Transport

Full-time international students may be eligible for a 50 per cent student discount on Queensland’s public transport fares. The comprehensive public transport network will help students get to their classroom, work, shops and tourist attractions. Go Card, an electronic IC card can be used across Queensland on the following TransLink services:

- Bus
- Train
- Ferry
- Tram

Some cities offer bike sharing services available for the public. Riders can pick up a bicycle from one of the cycle stations located across the city and return it at the destination station. Cycling is an affordable and healthy transportation option suitable for active students. Many cities have dedicated cycling paths to ensure the safety and convenience of cyclists and pedestrians.

Flights

Flying from Japan to Queensland is easy with regular flights connecting Brisbane, Gold Coast and Cairns to Tokyo and Osaka. Daily flights between Tokyo and Brisbane connect the two major cities in nine hours.

With five international airports and over 15 domestic airports situated across the state, students can enjoy a getaway to different regions within the state as well as nearby countries on weekends and holidays.



Queensland's international education and training industry

The international education and training industry encompass research, higher education, vocational education and training, schools, English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS), and non-award programs.

The high performance and growth of Queensland's international education and training sector are underpinned by internationally regarded academic staff, a well-regulated system and unrivalled education and research infrastructure.

Quality is priority in our institutions.

All international students are supported through:

- Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000
- National Code of Practice
- Registration Authorities and Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2007

International students are only able to study at an institution and in a course that is registered on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS).

Queensland boasts a leading education and training system comprising more than 300 schools, universities and vocational education and training providers across the state. Currently, Queensland attracts more than 135,000 students from more than 160 countries each year, creating an immersive and enriching environment for those who choose to further their study in one of these leading institutions.

About one-third of these students choose to study in a location outside of the capital city, making Queensland the leading Australian state in the delivery and support of regional international education and training.

Schools

Queensland schools have a reputation for academic excellence. You can access individualised learning experiences, internationally recognised qualifications and flexible pathways to further study in a wide range of subjects. International students can choose from a variety of short or long term, individual or group programs ranging in duration from three months (one school term) to five years.

State schools

Queensland Government schools provide students with an excellent choice of study pathways, enabling them to achieve their academic, career and personal development goals in a supportive and healthy environment. Education Queensland International (EQI) is an international award-winning body dedicated to managing the needs of international students and their families, enrolled in Queensland Government schools. The team will actively encourage students to achieve their academic potential in a safe and high quality learning environment.

Independent schools

Over 180 Queensland independent schools educate more than 116,000 students each year. Independent schools offer parents a choice that can best serve their child's needs by aligning with values they believe to be most important. All independent schools must comply with government regulations and standards.

Catholic schools

The state's Catholic schools strive to provide a high-quality education, advancing the common good of society and believe in the intrinsic value of each student based on a distinctive educational vision inspired by the example of Jesus Christ. Catholic schools implement national and state curriculum.

ELICOS

Queensland's English Language Institutions deliver high quality, innovative English language programs from well qualified teachers. Students can choose to study at one of Queensland's world-class private English language colleges, vocational education and training institutions, schools or universities. Ecosciences Precinct

This \$270 million precinct uses award-winning architecture and sustainable design principles to create a collaborative environment for more than 1000 scientists, dedicated to solving some of Australia's biggest environmental challenges.

Translational Research Institute

The Translational Research Institute (TRI) brings four of the country's pinnacle research facilities together to improve and accelerate medical research and translate that research into greater palliative care. The TRI allows biopharmaceuticals and treatments to be discovered, produced, clinically tested and manufactured in one location.

Streptococcus A Vaccine

Griffith University's Institute for Glycomics has developed a ground breaking combination vaccine that may finally beat Streptococcus A infections. Infections caused by Streptococcus pyogenes are responsible for the deaths of almost 500,000 people worldwide each year. Principal Research Leader at the Institute for Glycomics, Professor Michael Good said the team's latest research, shows that they are getting closer to beating Strep A once and for all.

Ultrasound-based dementia therapy

The Queensland Brain Institute at The University of Queensland is developing a dementia therapy based on the use of ultrasound to open the blood-brain barrier. The new technology has been trialled in animal models with good results, and preparations are now being made for human trials.

Renewable Energy Project

Queensland University of Technology (QUT) and the Research Centre for Advanced Science and Technology (RCAST) of The University of Tokyo signed an International Cooperation Agreement to develop joint venture projects and facilitate joint academic and scientific research activities in February 2018. QUT's Institute for Future Environments is working closely with RCAST to develop what could be the world's next renewable fuel – CO₂-free hydrogen made from Queensland's sunshine. A consortium of Japanese companies in energy, engineering and other relevant fields are involved in this joint program with an outlook for commercialisation.

Gold Coast Health and Knowledge Precinct

Asia-Pacific's emerging health and innovation hub, the 200-hectare Gold Coast Health & Knowledge Precinct (GCHKP) is a unique global business location for high-tech industry development, research collaboration and jobs of the future.
