APP 5 Privacy Collection Notice

The Royal Australian Air Force Events Team within the Department of Defence (Defence) must comply with the Australian Privacy Principles (APPs) contained in the *Privacy Act 1988* (Privacy Act), which govern the handling of personal information, including sensitive information.

The personal information collected will be used by Defence to manage your registration and attendance to the Air and Space Power Conference 2026 (ASPC26). This includes confirming relevant security or accessibility requirements for attending events.

We require your consent to collect sensitive information – specifically, passport details, such as biometric information or details which may reveal race or ethnicity, or dietary and accessibility requirements which may reveal health information – for the same purposes identified previously.

If you are registering a child or accompanying person to attend an event alongside you, we will also collect their personal information for the same purposes. We will also require consent from any accompanying person/s registering with you to collect sensitive information identified previously for the same purposes. We will also require consent from a parent or legal guardian for a child attending to collect their sensitive information, if you are not the parent or legal guardian of the child.

Your personal information may be disclosed to the following third parties for the purposes specified above:

- Defence contractors,
- Venues,
- Australian Border Force,
- Delegations from participating nations when present in Australia
- Event, transport, accommodation and facilitation providers and
- Contracted security officers at venues.

Your personal information will also be disclosed to participating nations for the purposes of arranging bilateral and multilateral meetings. By providing consent, you acknowledge and confirm that Defence's obligations under Australian Privacy Principle 8.1 will not apply to the disclosure.

This means that Defence is not required to take reasonable steps to ensure that an individual or entity located overseas handles the personal information in compliance with the Privacy Act. If you consent, Defence would not be accountable under the Privacy Act and you will not be able to seek redress under the Privacy Act. This does not preclude any redress provisions that may be applicable in other jurisdictions.

Defence will not use or disclose your personal information other than for the purposes specified above, unless the use or disclosure is in accordance with the Privacy Act or is required or authorised under another Australian law. Any information that you have provided will not be disclosed to a third party to be included in promotional/marketing emails. Should you not wish to provide the personal information in this form, the Air Force Events Team may be unable to process your registration for an event, and your registration may be cancelled.

The Defence Privacy Policy contains information on how an individual may apply for access to their personal information, and how an individual may apply to have their personal information amended. The Defence Privacy Policy also contains information on how to make a complaint to Defence if you consider Defence may have breached the APPs. You retain the right to withdraw or amend the scope of your consent at any time by contacting the Air Force Events Team at dafe.events@defence.gov.au. Please note that a withdrawal of consent before an event will be treated as a cancellation, and you will incur event cancellation fees as per the event Terms and Conditions.
