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

The ACNP National Conference will provide an opportunity to learn directly from industry leaders, build strong connections and network with nurse practitioners and leaders within the health professional community.






COVID-19 Health Advice



Practice good hygiene

Practicing good hygiene is the first step in preventing the spread of infectious diseases.

- Wash your hands often with soap and running water, for at least 20 seconds. Dry them with a paper towel or hand dryer. Alternatively use alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow.
- Stay home if you're unwell to avoid making others sick.



Physical distancing

Physical distancing (or social distancing) means avoiding close contact and crowded places wherever you can.

- Keep at least 1.5 metres distance from others wherever and whenever possible
- Avoid hugging and kissing
- Swap handshakes for a wave



Face masks

Face masks are an additional physical barrier to help stop the spread of COVID-19. You must wear a face mask in NSW in the following settings: at a public hospital or private health facility (including private hospitals or day procedure centres), in residential care facilities or hostels or if you are a household contact of a COVID-19 case and you are out of your home. It is currently generally recommended to wear a face mask in situations and places where physical distancing is not possible.



RAT Rules in NSW

Rapid antigen tests are an important tool in the fight against COVID-19 in NSW. If you return a positive RAT, you must register your test result via the Services NSW app or website. As of 9 September, most individuals who return a positive result can leave isolation after 5 days, provided they have no symptoms. If you're symptomatic but return a negative RAT, the government's advice is to take another rapid test in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If your result is still negative, you should isolate until your symptoms are gone. Should you receive a positive RAT result but have no symptoms, the government advises that you can take a PCR test as they offer more accurate results.
