


Our work with Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council (CASC) incorporates these ways of working:

• The overarching purpose of the Cherbourg Ethics / Research Council is for the Cherbourg community to have control over research that occurs in their community. This control by the community, includes what research happens, how, when, and with whom.

Research could take a number of forms, e.g.:

- Community-initiated and led research that brings in external researchers as needed
- Research that is co-initiated, co-designed and co-developed with external researchers
- Research initiated by external researchers who work in partnership with community


