The C No More model of care



Mobile Van

- Van equipped for hepatitis C clinical care
- Clinical nurse consultant and peer-worker
- Discreet, free, non-judgemental care



People on corrections orders

- Parked outside CCO
- 3 CCO sites
- Opportunistic engagement through peer worker



POC testing and prompt treatment

- Offered immediate point-of-care testing (Hep C Ab, reflex to RNA)
- Same-day initiation of treatment if eligible

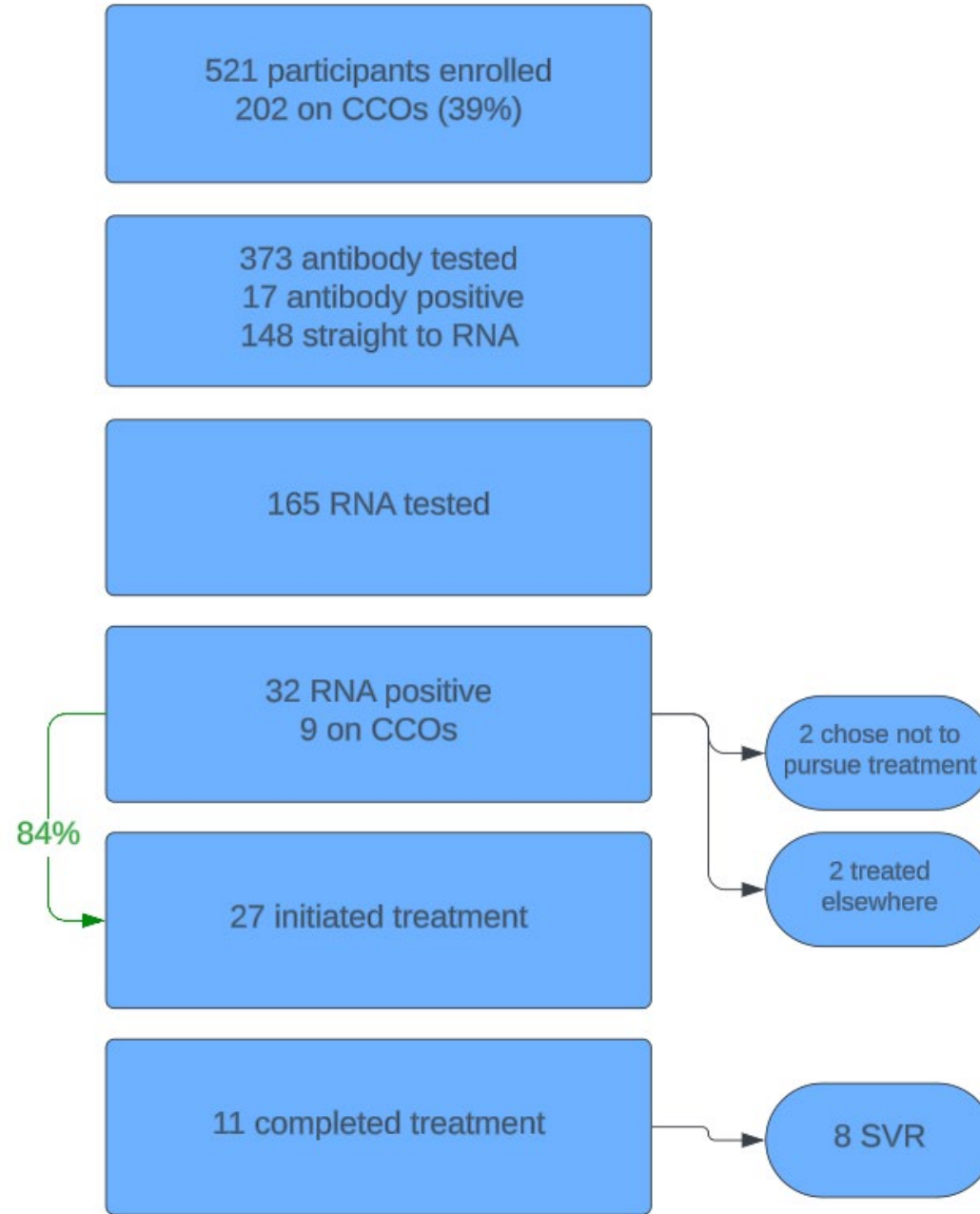
Results



Harm reduction services

Over 100 fits provided

Naloxone provided to 14 individuals





High rates of engagement and retention in care



Most of our participants are from the community-family and friends, and at-risk community members

To meet elimination goals, innovative models of care are needed to engage key populations in hepatitis care

A peer and nurse-led, mobile same-day model is effective at providing care to a population that is being missed with current strategies
