



Lack of confidentiality

About three-quarters (76%) of the overall sample had at some time wanted to seek STI treatment or HIV testing, but decided against it. The most common reasons were not having the time (44%), fear of knowing the test results (25%), worried about the confidentiality of the results (22%) and attitudes of the service providers (17%). See Figure 10.3.
