# Focus Testing New Testing Models

Focus testing potential online sexually transmissible infection (STI) and blood borne virus (BBV) testing models with priority populations in NSW


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- 1. Identify and understand the enablers and barriers to STI & BBV testing experienced by each priority population.
- **2.** Identify the key elements that would facilitate increased acceptability, accessibility, and usage of an online testing platform, as well as its promotion.

Models to be focus tested with priority populations:



#### Priority populations and sample size:

There will be 8 to 12 participants from each of the following priority population or sub-populations:

- Gay and bisexual men, and other men who have sex with men (GBMSM)
- Sexually active young people under the age of 30 years
- Trans and gender diverse people
- Sex workers
- People who inject drugs
- People in rural, regional, and remote locations
- Aboriginal people
  - Males
  - Females
  - Trans/gender diverse
- People from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds,
  - People who are overseas born and have arrived in Australia in the past four years
  - People from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

## Eligibility criteria:

- Self-identify as a member of a priority population/s
- Are aged 18 years or older at the time of the study
- Have access to the internet and/or a smart device
- Ability to comprehend and communicate in English

## Focus testing recruitment

- Each priority population will have a targeted recruitment strategy
- Relevant social media tiles and flyers will be developed for each priority population
- Social media tiles/flyers will be shared by stakeholders relevant to each priority population

#### **Project partnerships:**

A project advisory group and an Aboriginal advisory group were established to provide advice and guidance on the consultation process. Project advisory group includes representatives from:

- NSW Users and AIDS Association (NUAA)
- Youth Action
- NSW Multicultural HIV and Hepatitis Service (MHAHS)
- Local Health Districts
- Sex Workers Outreach Project (SWOP)

Results:

A findings report will be available in December 2023. Results will contribute to the evidence and contribute to informing online testing models in NSW.
