SERVICE NEEDS FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV.

DEMOGRAPHICS

- At the end of 2017, 27 545 Australians were estimated to be living with HIV
 - 20 922 infections were attributable to male-to-male sex,
 - 6 245 to heterosexual sex,
 - 605 to injecting drug use,
 - 168 to 'other' exposures
- At this time it was estimated that of those living with HIV:
 - 582 identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander
 - 2 529 were born in Southeast Asia
 - I 553 were born in Sub-Saharan Africa

AGE OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH DIAGNOSED HIV

- Since 1986 the number of Australians living with HIV has increased six-fold (4110 in 1986 to 24 645 in 2017).
- Improved survival rates of PLHIV has resulted in a drastic shift in the disease's age demographic with people over 50 accounting for 46% of the population.



COMPLEX CARE - NSW

- 2018 Positive Life NSW HIV Complex Care in NSW Consultancy Report
 - Fewer people are becoming infected but people living much longer.
 - Measurable change in backgrounds of people presenting to HIV services.
 - The younger cohort of PLHIV often lead chaotic lives with significant mental health and AOD issues.
 - Broader geographical residential distribution with limited commensurate service distribution.
 - 14% of PLHIV with complex care needs receive support of medium to high intensity.






AGE RANGES OF BGF'S CURRENT CLIENTS
