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HIV Futures

- Cross-sectional self completed
- HIV Futures 8 Data 2015/16 : N=895
- Study advertised through PLHIV organisations, PLHIV networks, clinics and other services, online

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Some points from HIV Futures 8

Overall, most PLHIV reported good levels of physical health and general health overall.

However this masks the diversity

- Varied considerably by age and other demographics
- Considerable prevalence of issues concerning mental health, isolation, comorbidities, and impact of stigma and discrimination

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Analysing and identifying the profiles

<u>Latent profile analysis</u> to identify groups (profiles) of participants according to several variables:

- Socio-demographic
- Subjective health (SF36)
- Self-reported emotional wellbeing (SF36)
- ART side effects
- Length of time living with HIV
- Treatment for comorbidities
- Health literacy

Identified 5 groups

Compared the groups on a range of other variables
