Background:

No jurisdiction in Australia has allowed regulated injecting equipment into prisons. This is in contrast to international experience, and support for this initiative by UN agencies, including the World Health Organization.

Results:

The ACT Chief Minister expressed public support for a needle-exchange program at the Alexander Maconochie Centre, on 15 August 2012. To this day, that promise has never materialized.

Conclusion:

Bloodborne virus transmission remains an enduring risk to residents and staff in Australian prisons.
