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BACKGROUND/AIMS & METHODS:

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
- Clinician experience suggests high rates of personality disorders among their HIV seropositive clients
- Audit aimed to estimate the prevalence of personality disorders presenting within client base
- ❖ Data to assist in informing service delivery and planning of the psychology unit

Study design/patient population

- HIV seropositive Albion Psychology clients (N=84)
- Cross-sectional survey completed as part of standard clinical care
- Study assessments
- Germans Personality Screener
- McLean Screening Instrument for Borderline Personality Disorder
- Statistical analysis
- Descriptive statistics

CONCLUSIONS/IMPLICATIONS:

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- · High rates of personality disorders indicated in Albion psychology client cohort
- This data has directed clinician training in evidence-based personality disorder treatments, specifically Schema Therapy and Trauma-Focused Therapy
- Increased clinician skills set / knowledge for a wider range of treatments capacity for long-term
- · Improved outcome for clients

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
