# Interim evaluation of the NSW DBS Study – dried blood spot testing for HIV and hepatitis C

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## HIV and HCV Dried Blood Spot (DBS) Testing Pilot



- Self-collection DBS samples for HIV and hepatitis C testing
- Among people at risk of infection (e.g. people who inject drugs, men who have sex with men, people born overseas, Aboriginal people and people with a history of incarceration)
- Two arms of registration:
  - a) Online registration
  - b) Assisted registration Community settings or prisons



 Samples are returned in the mail and results delivered by SMS, phone call or in person for linkage into care

#### Results





10,000+ registrations for a DBS test



8,696 tests completed



**7,392** unique people tested



## Conclusions and Implications



- The NSW DBS Pilot reaches people who have not recently tested for HCV or HIV
- High number of tests in prison settings and comparable high HCV treatment uptake
- Further investigation needed to understand issues with treatment uptake at home and in the community
