Inquiry into Drug Law Reform

Terms of Reference

- 1. The effectiveness of laws, procedures and regulations relating to illicit and synthetic drugs and the misuse of prescription medication in minimising drug related health, social and economic harm; and
- 2. The practice of other Australian states and territories and overseas jurisdictions and their approach to drug law reform and how other positive reforms could be adopted into Victorian Law.

- Committee hearings
- Site visits
- Final Report summarises findings and recommendations
- Government response

Key recommendations

- Framework for effective drug law reform
- Community attitudes and drugs
- Personal use and possession offenses
- Cannabis regulation
- Medication assisted treatment for opioid dependence
- Minimising the spread of BBVs

Next steps

- Pragmatic, evidence informed drug policy
 - Start with decriminalisation
 - Legalisation
- Build allies across party lines
