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Background

PRIOR TO 2012:

- Centralized system for ART services
- Less-effective referral system



- Low findings of HIV/AIDS cases
- Low coverage of PLHIV on ART



Background

2012

- MoH initiated an integrated decentralized HIV service delivery model → Layanan Komprehensif Berkesinambungan (**Comprehensive of Continuum HIV Care – COC**)
- To better control the HIV epidemic
- Represents the umbrella framework for accelerating HIV testing & expanding ARVs for treatment & prevention

2013

- **Strategic Use of ARVs (SUFA)** was developed as a more operational strategy for treatment as prevention
- Implemented before the “test and treat all” strategy
- A way to work with limited resources allocated for the whole country



Preparation and Support Activities

- Revised existing guidelines as needed;
- Addressed human resource needs;
- Procurement and supply management;
- Advocate with local health and administrative authorities and local professional associations as the acceleration strategy.
- Documented and socialized the ART scale-up initiative to local key stakeholders and their respective roles.
- Provided ongoing technical support from the national and provincial levels



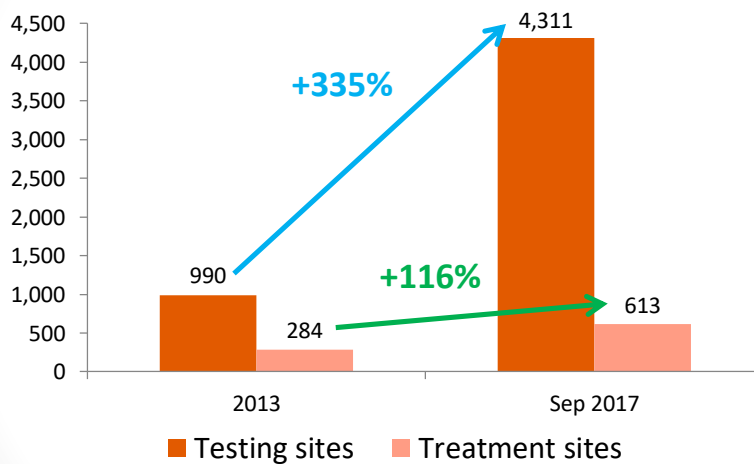
Implementation phase

- Districts were selected as the unit for SUFA implementation

- SUFA was conducted in 3 phases based on:
 - Local epidemic situation
 - Local government commitment in the form political and financial support
 - Social support systems
 - Comprehensiveness of available HIV-related services

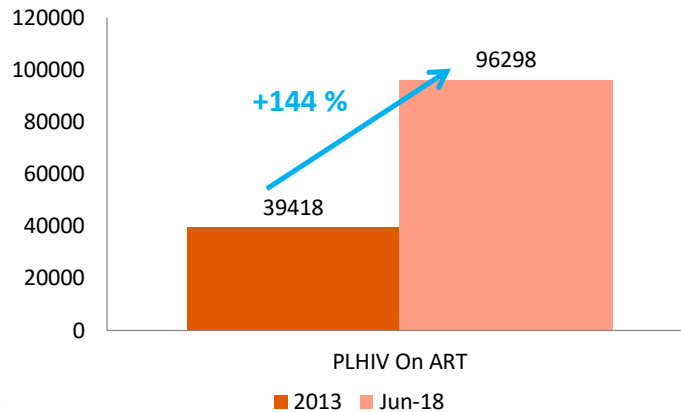


Results on HIV Services

Conclusion

- 1. Decentralizing ARV treatment to local Public Health Center, boosts ARV uptake**
- 2. Simplifying ART regimen increases the PLHIV adherence to treatment**
- 3. Referral system among Public Health Center and private clinics has well functioned.**
- 4. Working together with communities (PLHIV, KAP, Health Cadres) increases the success rate of program**



Future Action

- SUFA has laid the foundation for the next step of Indonesia to implement Fast Track 90-90-90, starting in 2018 and aiming to gradually achieve the targets by 2020 at several districts that have the most alarming HIV epidemic
