

Laryngeal syphilis in a HIV & Hepatitis B Co infected Patient , Liverpool university Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

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History	Thirty-six-year-old MSM presented with hoarseness of voice, mouth ulcers, alopecia and rash on genitalia for 1month. No dysphagia, Stridor or cough
Examination	Patchy alopecia on scalp Snail tract ulcers on buccal mucosa Macular scaly rash on penis
Investigation	RPR -positive Liaison antibody -positive Syphilis antibody –positive TP PCR on penile lesion -Positive
Diagnosis and management	Secondary syphilis with laryngeal involvement. Treated with a single dose of benzathine penicillin 2.4 MU
Discussion	Laryngeal syphilis is rare. Can occur during secondary or tertiary stages. Present as ulcers of larynx, causing hoarseness of voice and dysphonia
Take home message	Laryngeal syphilis should be considered in syphilis patients presenting with hoarseness



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
