



Many strands make up one rope

- Growing international evidence suggested that re-calibrating the strategy towards combination prevention would help us realise our goal
- Sector collaboration was essential for implementing combination prevention
- Existing political settings were not aligned to this approach



- Advocating for and achieving the public funding of PrEP
- Ensuring clinical sector ready and equipped
- Encouraging PrEP uptake among non-condom users




97% of MSM know condoms are the most effective prevention for




91% of high-risk MSM understand the role of PrEP, up from 62%

13.5% of MSM accessing funded PrEP








Impact and next steps







- We're heartened to see the first decrease in 6 years
- However, we need to see a steady consistent decrease over the next few years before we can confidently say we are on the right track
- To continue this momentum we now need political leadership and increased resources to reinforce our rope
- Next steps? 25% of MSM wanting PrEP feel uncomfortable speaking with their GP
