How do we find this information?

- Education sessions delivered to 216 patients living with Chronic Hepatitis B (CHB), between Dec 2022-Dec 2023.
- Their use of traditional medicines and supplements (TM/S) is explored.
- Advised to notify and discuss any use TM/S with their GPs.







Definitions

Traditional medicines: any oral traditional medicines.

Supplements: any oral supplements.

What Did We Find?



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Reported Traditional Medicines Used

- Turmeric
- Artichoke flower
- An xoa (Helicteres hirsuta)











Reported Traditional Medicines Used

- Ginseng
- Honey
- Snake capsules (made by snake's bone, flesh)
- Linh Chi (also called LingZhi, Reishi)













Reported Supplements Used

- Liver detox tablets
- Sheep placenta tablets
- Royal jelly capsules
- Fish oil capsules
- Spirulina tablets















Reported Supplements Used

- Shark cartilage
- Collagen
- Hrbvor tea











Why Do Clients Use Traditional Medicines ?

- **Tuệ Tĩnh's ideology:** "Southern medicine for Southern people".
- **Traditional medicines practice**: "Thanh nhiệt giải độc" means "clear heat and detoxify" is key of hepatitis treatment.
- Hold on strongly to this belief and their culture.







TM/S and Hepatitis B Treatment

- Can TM/S have potential interactions with hepatitis B treatment drugs?
 - Can TM/S reduce the effectiveness of hepatitis B treatment?
- Can TM/S reduce renal function?

Use TM/S while Not On/ On Hepatitis B treatment







TM/S Disclosure to GP

- Not disclosing TM/S use to GP is an issue of concern. Why?
- Do patients have self-stigma about using TM/S?
- Do their GPs have enough time for them to disclose?
- Afraid of conflict with Western trained GP's belief if they disclose?

Disclose/ Did not disclose use TM/S to GP







In Summary

Findings:

- 14% Vietnamese people living with CHB use TM/S. Could be just tip of iceberg.
- Concurrent use of TM/S with Hepatitis B treatment drugs.
- Not disclosing the use of TM/S to their GPs.
- The work of highly trained peer bi-lingual community health workers is an effective way to explore this phenomenon.
- Peers, sharing same language, having work experiences, understanding the culture and belief which result in building trust relationship.
