Network	Priorities
<b>Coalition Plus</b>	Involvement of communities in the development and implementation of elimination plans at national level
<b>Correlation</b>	Provide testing and treatment in harm reduction and community settings
<b>EATG</b>	No Elimination without decriminalization: the impact of repressive drug policies on health and quality of life
	Reaching out to key populations in prison settings
<b>ELPA</b>	Testing and micro-elimination as targeted national elimination of viral hepatitis C in well-defined populations
<b>EHRA</b>	Reducing the inequality in the access to HCV testing and treatment in CEECA for people who use drugs (PWUD)
<b>EuroNPUD/ INPUD</b>	HCV programs should not focus on reducing drug and alcohol use
	Care programs must not individualize or blame PWUD. Structural barriers should be brought to the fore
<b>IDHDP</b>	People who are currently injecting should be prioritized
	Treatment and prevention should occur at the same time
