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Sexual and gender diverse young people: health status

- Compared to young people generally:
- Additional barriers to SRH care
- > Poorer wellbeing, mental health and physical health
- > SSA youth less likely to use condoms & more likely to be sexually active at an earlier age, contract an STI and have an unintended pregnancy
- Strong links between homophobic and transphobic abuse and excessive drug use, self-harm and suicide attempts
- Intersections with disability, Indigenous status, CALD, rural & remote

Sexual and gender diverse young people: health service interactions

Positive interactions crucial to ongoing healthcare engagement and to foster resilience and wellbeing

- > BUT negative experiences commonly reported
- marginalised young people perceive and experience multiple forms of discrimination
- ACCESS 3 SGDYP participants expressed ambivalence about their healthcare journeys





Sexual and gender diverse young people: health service interactions

Obstacles to care:

- confidentiality concerns
- access and costs
- health literacy
- assumptions of heterosexuality
- professional discomfort (transphobic stigma, prejudice, discrimination and abuse)
- lack of health professional knowledge and skills
- lack of resources and referral networks





Sexual and gender diverse young people: what do optimal health services look like?

- > Accessible, affordable, flexible
- Non-judgmental confidential care by knowledgeable trained staff
- Up to date evidence-based practice which allows young people to engage in decision-making
- Culturally safe and inclusive, comfortable and friendly
- Youth participation in service planning
- Recognition of multiple vulnerabilities coordinated services, referral pathways and navigation supports
- > Inclusive systems approaches and use of technology




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




Sexual and gender diverse young people: policy frameworks, guidelines and standards of care

- Proposed NZ mental healthcare framework includes need to reduce stigma and enhance young people's safety


- Medical schools, nursing, midwifery training

Headspace National Reference Group is made up of a diverse group of young people of varying ages, genders and cultural backgrounds








Sexual and gender diverse young people: accreditation for inclusive practice and service delivery

- Rainbow Tick national Accreditation Program a benchmark
- Used as part of QIP accreditation
- National register

Six Standards:

- Organisational capability
- Workforce development
- Consumer participation
- Welcoming and accessible
- Disclosure and documentation
- Culturally safe and acceptable services
- Provides a welcoming signal and reassurance to the community







Sexual and gender diverse young people: Medicare and other systems

- Understanding Medicare
- own Medicare card from 15
- > 2013 pledge to delink system from gender
- doctors letter required to update gender marker
- MyHealthrecord
- Practice-based and pathology data collection systems
- A gender mismatch between systems does not prevent processing of Medicare billing









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Summing up

- Awareness increasing at all levels of health sector
- Increasing training and professional development opportunities
- Quality improvements occurring linked to accreditation
