- Cepheid GeneXpert[®]
- Stages:
 - TTANGO Trial RCT 2014-2015 (12 sites)
 - TTANGO2 Translational research phase 2016-2020 (32 sites)
 - > TTANGO3 Operational phase in 2021 (>60 sites)
- Collaboration between Kirby Institute (UNSW) and Flinders University International Centre for Point-of-Care Testing







Quality Testing

- Monthly QC testing
- On-line QC entry in Program website (<u>www.ttango.com.au</u>) with corrective action requirements
- Quarterly feedback reports
- Mean annual concordance:
 - ➤ CT/NG = 100% (n=1488)
 - ➤ TV = 99.6% 100% (n=1108)
- Quarterly EQA testing
- On-line EQA result submission (<u>www.ttango.com.au</u>)
- EQA feedback reports, developed for primary care operators
- Mean concordance:
 - CT/NG = 97.9% (15 testing events, n=1512)
 - > TV = 99.2% (9 testing events, n=761)

Conclusion

- TTANGO has built a strong workforce capacity to conduct STI testing in primary care setting to high analytical standard
- Main outcomes of program:
 - Clinical perspective reduced time to treatment
 - Cost effectiveness every \$1 invested saves Aus govt \$1.97 in staff time and morbidity due to delay in treating or untreated infections
- Continuously supported through various Australian Government funding sources for 10 years.
