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

Background & Methods

What do we know about young people's sexual health needs?

- Australian research focuses on whole populations
- Limited research with young people from migrant backgrounds or whose families born overseas
- Cultural norms and practices often limit learning about sex and relationships in families/at home
- Chinese-Australian young people overlooked



Family attitudes to relationships and dating among young people

IF YOU ARE


- AGED BETWEEN 18 TO 25,

Findings highlight that Chinese-Australian young people:

- are learning and navigating relationships and sex in different ways
- Experience challenges in accessing information and emotional and practical supports
- Require supports that are culturally tailored to their needs

“...how we don't talk about sexual health is very telling as to how our mental health is...it requires us to reflect on how we grew up, like our [family] dynamics...when I look back at how I talk about sexual health...I wish I had a space where I could openly discuss these things’... It made me realize...I'm not actually able to do [this] or to feel safe...yeah it does impact your mental health, you know, it impacts your emotional well-being.”
