The STATS

Youth '12

- We are coming out younger

 We are more likely to volunteer in our church, sports team or community

The STATS: SBSAY

Youth '12

- 59.4% had deliberately selfharmed.
- 41.3% had significant depressive symptoms.
- 18.3% attempted suicide in the last 12 months.
- 35.7% had difficulty getting help for their emotional concerns.

The STATS: TGDY

Youth '12

- 40% had significant depressive symptoms

- Nearly half had self-harmed in the previous 12 months.
- 1 in 5 attempted suicide in the last year
- Nearly 40% of transgender students had been unable to access health care when they needed it

Law and Policy New Zealand

- "Conversion therapy" is legal
- Gender Identity is not a protected grounds of non discrimination in our HR act
- Non consensual surgeries are still being performed on intersex children while trans young people are being denied surgeries.

Stigma and discrimination

Impacts of minority stress in sexual health delivery

- Lack of access to appropriate sexual health education: refer to latest MOE report
- Barriers to testing and delivery of sexual health services
- Experience high rates of sexual violence

How can we translate this into empowerment?

The TO DO list:

- COUNT us in national data
- Comprehensive sexual health education + anti bullying policies
- Emergency housing
- Legislative protections and reform
- Co-design health services with rainbow young people
- Asylum and refugee support services
