Colonisation and tobacco

Introduced by the colonizer used as trading and currency

Rights established under Te Tiriti

Early Māori leadership exposed dangers from tobacco - legal sanctions

Indigenous Tobacco control leadership has been evident since late 1800s

Rights Based Intervention

Tobacco Industry and its products are an impediment to Māori aspirations and goals.

Tobacco impacts severely on Māori culture, economic, health and social wellbeing.

I can't believe that we are even discussing smokeless tobacco at this seminar," (Opening of Auckland University Tobacco Control Research Centre in 2006)

"Some argue that it is a less harmful alternative to cigarettes. But what you effectively have here is experts in the Smokefree sector colluding with the tobacco industry to sell their product".

2009 Māori Affairs Select Committee Inquiry launched into the tobacco industry in Aotearoa and the consequences of tobacco use for Māori



The Committee's report made 42 recommendations to the Government; the first of these called for a goal of making New Zealand a smokefree nation by 2025.



Health minister's notes similar to tobacco industry investigation finds

Revealed: Tobacco tax freeze was Associate Health Minister Casey Costello's idea

The notes, which have been obtained by RNZ, also include proposals for more tax breaks for the tobacco industry, including no excise tax on tobacco products that are heated rather than burned.

Costello confirmed she had links to the New Zealand Taxpayers' Union, but has no association or involvement with the tobacco industry.
