Benefits of UVL

- o Partner 2 study and Opposites Attract
- Heterosexual and homosexual couples, pos partner had UVL and the neg partner not on PrEP
- No transmissions in about 125,000 sex acts
- No transmissions in ~90,000 anal sex acts
- Undetectable = Untransmittable, U=U or UVL is form of safe sex
- Modelling predicts without high treatment coverage in Australia, HIV diagnoses would have increased










Other benefits of PrEP?


I feel that I'm finally fully **enjoying sex for the first time** in my life. I don't go through the **anxiety** all the time. I will, now normally I wouldn't go to an HIV test thinking, "Maybe this is the time, maybe I've got it now." Now I'm not worried about HIV, to be honest. I, I feel quite safe. And, and then also associating sex with full pleasure and not just physical but also the full connection that you have, especially with a regular partner where **using condoms** feels like you are taking some of that intimacy and pleasure, physical pleasure away.













Recent HIV infections in MSM in NSW, before and after PrEP, by age in years




Recent HIV infections in MSM in NSW, before and after PrEP, by area of residence




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Recent HIV infections in MSM in NSW, before and after PrEP, by region of birth



- Cautiously optimistic about reductions
- Maintain current efforts and focus
- UNAIDS targets of 95:95:95 by 2022
- PrEP coverage to 90% ideally in 3 years
- Sustain and enhance peer-led prevention responses for sex workers and people who inject drugs




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Next steps – research and surveillance

- Subpopulations
 - More behavioural and contextual data
 - HIV diagnoses and care cascades
- Cascade for PrEP
- Targets for quality of life and reducing stigma and discrimination
- Improve data collection for transgender people
