





All critical for attaining global targets of ending infectious diseases as a global health threat by 2030.

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

UNITE's contribution for inclusion of Viral Hepatitis in UHC Declaration



Hon. Mariam Jashi (UNITE's Regional Chair for Eastern Europe & Central Asia), in partnership with Thailand, was able to "successfully strengthen efforts to address communicable diseases" by leading a political voice of the work conducted by World Hepatitis Alliance (Civil Society Engagement Mechanism for UHC, CSEM2030) to ensure the term 'viral hepatitis' was included amongst HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria in Article 32 of the UN Political Declaration on Universal Health Coverage, signed at the UN High Level Meeting on September 23, 2019.

Global Declaration to Eliminate Hepatitis C in People Who Use Drugs

A call for political leaders to take action

We, members and representatives of the community working to eliminate hepatitis C — a community that includes people living with viral hepatitis, people who use drugs, advocates, health care providers, programme managers, harm reduction experts, researchers, the pharmaceutical industry, and policy-makers — are concerned with the gap between the global impact of hepatitis C on the health and well-being of people who use drugs and the limited access to evidence-based services effective for the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of hepatitis C infection.
