



The Australian Comprehensive Cancer Network (ACCN)

The ACCN is a virtual national network that connects cancer services across Australia. It brings together cancer services, existing networks and alliances within and across states and territories to enable collaboration, sharing of expertise, and access to comprehensive cancer care for all people affected by cancer. Anchored by Comprehensive Cancer Centres (CCCs), the ACCN strives to deliver evidence-driven prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and support to all Australians affected by cancer.

Through the ACCN, health services will have the opportunity to connect with CCCs and other centres of excellence that can provide specialist knowledge, clinical expertise, and capability. This will ensure that all patients throughout Australia will have access to the highest quality care as close to home as safely possible.

The ACCN does not duplicate existing networks or alliances within and between jurisdictions that deliver cancer care or conduct cancer research and clinical trials.
