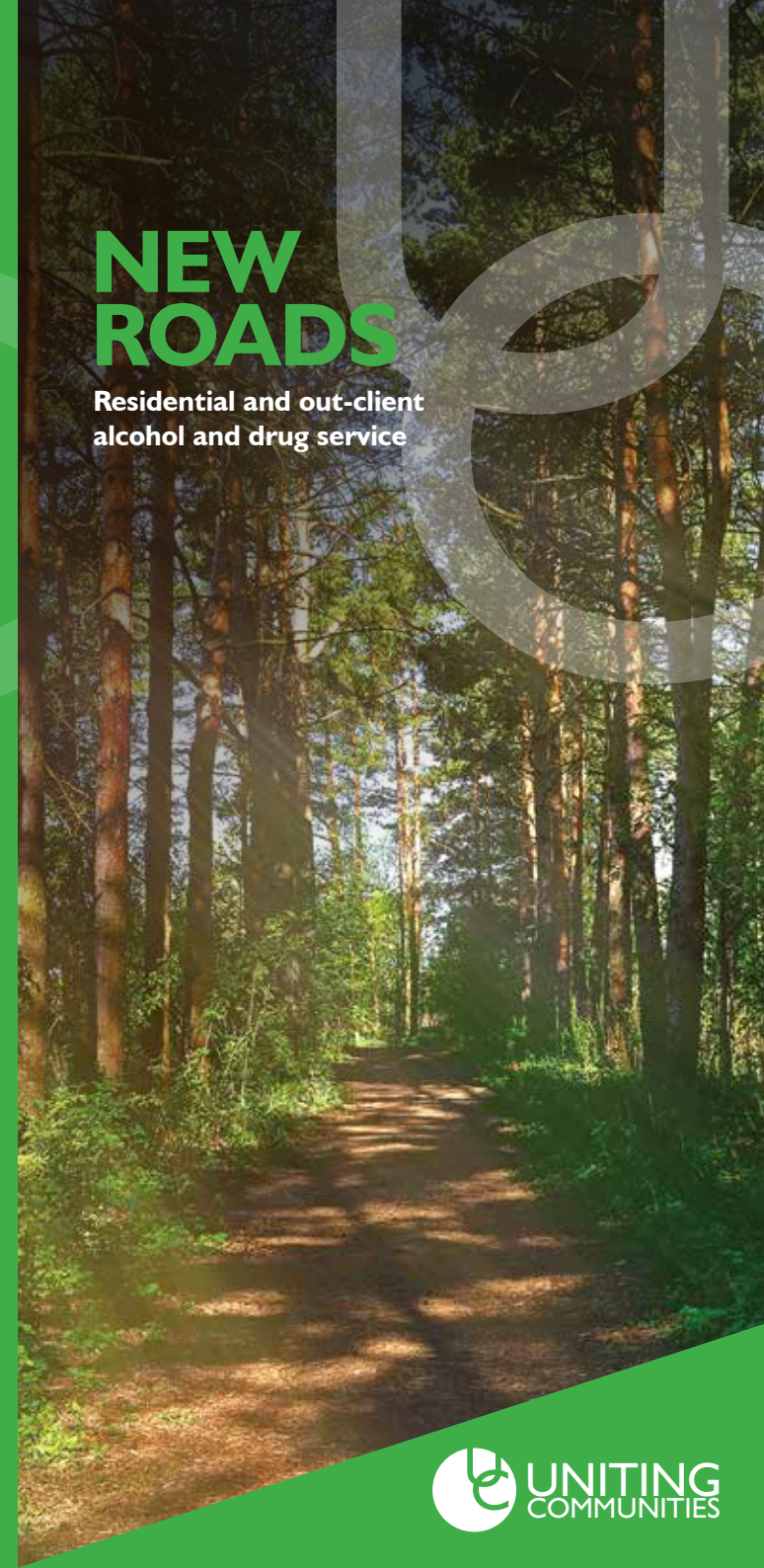

IS DRUG OR ALCOHOL USE AFFECTING YOUR LIFE?

New ROADS can help.

New ROADS (Residential and Out-Client Alcohol and Other Drug Service) offers a range of services, including residential rehabilitation, counselling, and group support for people who are experiencing problems with drugs or alcohol, and their families.

Our programs are designed to assist with your physical and mental health, as well as strengthen your connections to the community.

Supporting you and your family through rehabilitation

We will work with you as you develop goals for recovery. Our team can help you find ways to help you commit to these and provide practical support to achieve them.

You can refer yourself to our services, or this can be done by a family member, case worker or another service.

We can speak with you about:

- your health, family and relationship needs
- practical support for making changes in your life
- your housing needs
- ways to deal with issues that can make drug or alcohol use worse.

Services to suit you

Residential rehabilitation

In this program, you live in a shared house as you work on your treatment plan and receive support to make healthy long-term changes. This involves weekly counselling sessions on your own and in a group. The program is based on a five-month stay, but this is flexible.

This community-based residential program is available in metropolitan Adelaide, Mt Gambier, Whyalla and the Riverland and is for adults aged 21 and over.

Counselling

Counselling is an important part of all of our programs. Our New ROADS counsellors will provide practical support and advice to help you make important changes in your life.

Even if you're not part of one of our rehabilitation programs, you can attend counselling. You can come to counselling sessions on your own or join a group.

These sessions can help you to understand and change your use of alcohol and other drugs.

Counselling is available in metropolitan Adelaide, Smithfield, Christies Beach, Mt Gambier, Whyalla and the Riverland.

Connect to other services

In addition to our range of programs, we offer high-level assistance to connect you with other health, community and social services. We can also provide support to your family members affected by substance dependency.

Working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples

If you are an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person, we will support you in a way that respects your culture and belief.

We have strong links with other agencies in SA and work closely with Aboriginal Community Connect, our sister service at Uniting Communities.
