Following the tour, Laila will give a short talk on the **Civic Collection display**, after which you are invited to explore the display at your own pace.

The **National School Archives SIG Networking Meeting** brings together school archivists from across Australia for an afternoon of professional learning, discussion, and collaboration. This engaging session will feature three key components, each focusing on current issues and opportunities in school archives practice:

### 1. TROVE Presentation

Discover how your school archive or library can become part of the **Trove Partner network**, joining over 30 schools and educational institutions already contributing to this national platform. The **free Trove Content Contributor package** allows schools using a Trove-compatible collection management system to export catalogue records directly to Trove and access partner rates for digitisation projects.

Even if you're not ready to become a partner, **Trove Collaborative Services** offers opportunities to digitise significant materials – such as school magazines and newsletters – so they can appear directly on Trove. Examples of schools already participating include: Beacon – Coffs Harbour High School; Portal – Brisbane Boys' College; The Seagull – Tweed River High School; The Canberran – Canberra Grammar School; Karbai – Bamaga State High School; and Daramalan College Magazine.

These digitised collections not only preserve heritage but also strengthen school communities by enabling alumni and researchers to engage with, and even enhance, the records as Trove Correctors.

### 2. Stories from Our Archives

Reflect on and share stories from your archives that connect to the 2025 ASA Conference theme: "Telling Our Stories: Community, Connection, Resilience." Participants are encouraged to bring a story that highlights community engagement, connection, or resilience within their school archives.

## 3. Round-Table Discussion on RRDS

This open discussion will focus on the implementation and practical application of the **Records Retention and Disposal Schedule (RRDS)** within school archives.

Representatives from different states and territories will share insights into how the schedule is being interpreted and applied across various jurisdictions. The session will explore both comprehensive and flexible approaches to managing records in accordance with the RRDS, recognising that schools operate with differing capacities and requirements. Participants will be encouraged to exchange experiences, challenges, and ideas to support effective and compliant recordkeeping across the school archives community.
