Working as a negotiator / facilitator /educator on large-scale multi-party negotiations and disputes, within government and private sector, and Not-for-Profit organisations, he delivers training in negotiation, dispute prevention and how to have healthy considered conversations.

Allan has extensive experience working in regional and rural Australia, from areas of water allocation and policy, large scale multi-party negotiation, through to Family Succession facilitation. He played a signification role in the transition of the Cattle Council of Australia to Cattle Australia, the restructure of the Murray Irrigation, as well as setting up a collaborative integration plan for the Horticultural industry.

Allan has presented, facilitated, and moderated in over 60 different countries around the world, and at 4-6 Rural Conferences and Field Days each year for the past 20 years.

He was a writer and a professor on the master's program of Dispute Resolution at the School of Law and Business, University of Western Sydney, where he was appointed Adjunct Professor for his contribution to the field. In 2012, Allan wrote Australia's first degree in negotiation.

In 2020, Allan was a recipient for the Order of Australia Medal for his contribution to business and dispute resolution.
