President's Welcome

Friends,

I'm delighted to welcome you to the 29th National General Assembly (NGA) of Local Government – our largest event in Australian Local Government Association history!

This year we will discuss how our 537 local governments can best partner with the Federal Government to deliver a better future for our communities.

We will also hear from Local Government Minister Catherine King, as well as Opposition Leader Peter Dutton, and discuss your council motions, which will help shape ALGA's future policy and advocacy platforms to be determined by your ALGA Board.

Over the past 12 months, we have worked closely with the new Federal Government to bring local government back to the table, attending a range of National Cabinet and Ministerial Council meetings.

Each day, we work incredibly hard with you to advocate for increased funding for all councils, and for our local communities.

This advocacy has driven results for your local government, including:

- \$3.1 billion in Federal Assistance Grants, an increase of \$100m;
- a brand new \$200 million Disaster Mitigation Fund, to support councils to build more resilient and stronger infrastructure and prevent damage from future disaster events;
- \$1 billion in new regional funding, which councils can apply for under the Growing Regions and Regional Precincts and Partnerships programs;
- \$350 million in funding for urban councils through the new Urban Precincts and Partnerships and Thriving Suburbs programs;
- \$13.5 million for remote airstrip upgrades; and
- \$236 million over 10 years for rain gauges and other flood warning systems.

We continue to advocate for an increase in Financial Assistance Grants to at least one percent of Commonwealth taxation revenue and call on the Federal Government to deliver on their election commitment for a "fair increase" for FA Grants.

We also continue to advocate for new funding programs that will allow councils to take more action to address dangerous climate change, protect ourselves from cyber security risks and support the delivery of more housing.

Finally, in a major advocacy win for local government, we are delighted to partner with the Government this year on the historic return of the Australian Council of Local Government (ACLG).

Returning for the first time in a decade, the ACLG will allow mayors to join the Prime Minister, Cabinet Ministers and the Government to meet and create better ways to work together. The ACLG will follow and be informed by discussions at this year's NGA.

Finally, we couldn't stage this historic annual event without the generous support of our sponsors and exhibitors. Please visit them in the Exhibition Hall and learn how they can help your council and community.

I trust you will enjoy this year's ALGA Conference and I look forward to seeing you there!





HIS EXCELLENCY GENERAL THE HONOURABLE DAVID HURLEY AC DSC (RETD)

Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia

His Excellency General the Honourable David John Hurley AC DSC (Retd) was sworn in as the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia on 1 July 2019.

David Hurley joined the Australian Army in January 1972, graduating from the Royal Military College, Duntroon into the Royal Australian Infantry Corps. In a long and distinguished 42-year military career, his service culminated with his appointment as Chief of the Defence Force.

Prior to being sworn in as Governor-General, David Hurley served as the 38th Governor of New South Wales from October 2014 – May 2019.

He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Letters from the University of Wollongong in 2013; a Doctor of the University, honoris causa, from the University of New South Wales in 2015; made a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Technology and Engineering in 2016; and awarded an Honorary Doctorate from Macquarie University in 2017.



THE HON CATHERINE KING MP

Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government

Catherine King was born in Melbourne. She holds a Degree in Social Work and a Masters in Public Policy from the Australian National University and has recently completed a law degree from Deakin University.

First elected to Federal Parliament in 2001 to represent the electorate of Ballarat, Catherine has been re-elected as member at each subsequent Federal election.

Following the 2019 election, Catherine was appointed to the role of Shadow Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development in the Shadow Cabinet led by the Hon. Anthony Albanese.

Prior to entering Parliament, Catherine worked in the social welfare sector in Ballarat and later in the public sector in Canberra, as a director for the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care and as a senior manager at KPMG's Health Consulting Practice.



THE HON PETER DUTTON MP

Leader of the Opposition

Peter Dutton is the Federal Member for Dickson and Leader of the Liberal Party.

For nine years, Peter served his community as a Police Officer. He worked in the National Crime Authority and Drug and Sex Offenders' Squads, with a focus on protecting women and children.

First elected to Parliament in November 2001, Peter was appointed to the Ministry in 2004. In January 2006, he became Peter Costello's Assistant Treasurer.

Peter is married to Kirilly and is the proud father of Rebecca, Harry and Tom and lives in Dayboro in the Dickson electorate.




JIMMY REES

Jimmy Rees, aka Jimmy Giggle of ABC's Giggle and Hoot, is a household name whose videos became a public service during the pandemic, giving the Australian public a good laugh when the headlines were anything but amusing. A regular on Australian television and now with his headline comedy show 'Meanwhile in Australia' sold out across the country, Jimmy has become a multi-generational favourite and one of the most-watched social media personalities of recent years.

Jimmy Rees was studying Media Arts and looking to a career on stage when the opportunity came to audition for a new pre-school program on the ABC, Australia's national broadcaster. The program was called Giggle & Hoot and the rest, as they say is history. Jimmy Rees became Jimmy Giggle, the face of the ABC for a new generation. Since the debut of Giggle & Hoot on December 4th 2009, Jimmy and his best mate 'Hoot' have become household names around the nation.

Ambassador of Ukraine

Vasyl Myroshnychenko resumed the functions of the Ambassador of Ukraine to Australia on 1 April 2022.

He briefly served as an Advisor to the Minister of Defence of Ukraine in March–April of 2022.

Between May 2021 and July 2022, Vasyl served as a member of the Supervisory Board of the Ukrainian Institute, a cultural diplomacy outfit of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine.

Prior to joining the Foreign Service, he was an active business and civil society leader in Ukraine.

From 2006 to 2022, he was a Partner at CFC Big Ideas, a Kyiv-based strategic communications company. He has 20 years of experience advising clients on corporate communications, public affairs and reputation management. Vasyl advised many multinational companies and domestic industry leaders across various sectors.

Vasyl is a co-founder of Ukraine Crisis Media Center, a media NGO set up in early March of 2014 aimed at amplifying Ukraine's voice internationally. He was in charge of numerous projects and campaigns during 2014–2019.



DR JONATHAN CARR-WEST

CEO, Local Government Information Unit UK

Dr Jonathan Carr-West has been Chief Executive of LGIU (Local Government Information Unit) since February 2013, where he leads on all aspects of the think tank's policy, membership and influencing work.

LORD MAYOR SALLY CAPP

City of Melbourne

Sally Capp was re-elected Lord Mayor of Melbourne in October 2020 after having previously been elected in May 2018 and is the first woman to be directly elected as Lord Mayor.

Sally was the first woman to hold the post of Agent-General for Victoria in the UK, Europe and Israel. She has also served as the CEO for the Committee for Melbourne and Victorian Executive Director of the Property Council of Australia.

A passionate Collingwood Football Club supporter, in 2004 Sally made history as the first female board member of Collingwood Football Club.

Sally began her career as a Solicitor, after completing Law (Hons) and Commerce degrees at the University of Melbourne.

She has held senior roles at both KPMG and ANZ, and co-founded a small business which she took to the ASX. She is involved in a number of charities, currently sitting on the board of the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research Institute, the Mary Jane Lewis Scholarship Foundation and the Melbourne University Faculty of Business and Economics.



MAYOR HEATHER HOLMES-ROSS

City of Mitcham

Dr Heather Holmes-Ross is serving her second term as Mayor of The City of Mitcham.

A former research scientist in molecular dynamics at Flinders Uni, she and her husband founded the award-winning Artisan Cafe renowned for its sustainable and ethical practices. They currently operate "The Lost Dice" board game cafe in Adelaide's CBD, which services a fabulously diverse community.

Heather is passionate about building strong, sustainable, inclusive communities, which lead her to local government. She has led her council in making sector leading decisions, including the creation of a citywide solar and virtual power plant scheme which reduces green house gas emissions, stabilises the grid and generates income for residents.



MAYOR KAREN VERNON

Town of Victoria Park

Karen Vernon was elected to Victoria Park Council as a councillor in 2017 and in 2019 was directly elected as Mayor, becoming the first female mayor of the Town. Karen is also Chairperson of Mindarie Regional Council, WA's largest waste management authority, becoming the first female to hold that position in 30 years in 2021.

A lawyer by profession, Karen practised for 28 years, including 17 years as a barrister. She is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, serving on numerous boards over the last 20 years including the National Stroke Foundation and St Vincent de Paul Society (WA), both causes close to her heart.

She is a courageous, effective and resilient leader, steering her council through the challenges and opportunities of COVID19.

Karen sees a strong strategic focus and commitment to meaningful community engagement as essential to empowering her community to achieve their collective aspirations for the future.



MAYOR ROSS ANDREWS


Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council
Ross Andrews is a proud Djungan and Yalanji man of Far North Queensland. He is the Mayor of Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council, managing portfolios across all areas of the Indigenous local government area.

This is Ross's second term as Mayor and he has significant experience in local government at both political and managerial level. He is widely regarded amongst his peers and within government circles.

Ross is also a respected advocate of Indigenous leadership and self-determination and whilst he is respectful of tradition and culture, he is also acknowledged as a progressive leader who supports and encourages innovation, inclusion and participation amongst First Nations peoples.

Ross sits on the Far North Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils (FNQROC), member of Torres Cape Indigenous Council Alliance (TCICA), a Steering Committee member on the Tropical North Queensland First Nations Action Plan 2023 and Interim Chairperson of the Yarrabah Leaders Forum which sets the strategic direction of Yarrabah.

He is a family man who loves fishing and camping and a passionate volunteer of the Yarrabah Seahawks Sports Club.



MAYOR MATTHEW RYAN

West Arnhem Regional Council
Matthew Ryan was elected as Mayor for West Arnhem Regional Council at the Local Government Election in 2017 and was re-elected in 2021.

A community leader in Maningrida for well over a decade, Mayor Ryan believes in promoting Indigenous rights and remains a fierce advocate for the big issues which affect those at the grass roots level including education, telecommunications, enrolment and health.

Matthew was born in Royal Darwin Hospital and raised in Maningrida, where he lives with his wife Charlene Bonson and their four children.

A long term representative and voice for his community, Matthew has held the position of Councillor for the Maningrida Ward since West Arnhem Regional Council was established, as West Arnhem Shire Council in 2008.

Over the years, he has sat on a number of Council committees, including the Special Finance Committee, CEO Employment and Remuneration Advisory Panel and he has been a member of the Risk Management and Audit Committee since 2017.



CR ESMA LIVERMORE

Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council
Esma Livermore is the Current Deputy Mayor of the Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council. She was elected to Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council in 2021 and is the first identified Indigenous woman to be elected in the Council's history.

Esma works for Reconciliation Australia's Narragunnawali team, since 2016. While actively contributing across the range of Narragunnawali program areas, Esma has played a key role in coordinating the national Narragunnawali Awards initiative, first launched in 2017 to recognise reconciliation excellence in the education sector.

Esma has held previous roles as an Aboriginal Community Liaison Officer for the NSW Department of Education. She was President of the Queanbeyan local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group for 6 years and is passionate about the power of local community efforts to contribute to our national reconciliation journey.

Esma is representing the Australian Local Government Association on the Referendum Engagement Group.

MAYOR PHILLEMOS MOSBY

Torres Strait Island Regional Council Mayor Mosby is the second person to step into the Mayoralty since the Council's amalgamation in 2008. He brings a youthful and innovative approach to the role, backed by a strong dossier in community development and local government service, which has included several roles within the amalgamated Council and the previous Island Council, such as administration, housing and tenancy management, engagement and advocacy, and many voluntary positions within the local community.

Working tirelessly over the last two decades, Mayor Mosby has continuously advocated for action on global warming and protection from the devastating effects climate change is having on island communities within the Torres Strait. His advocacy has also focused on the preservation of cultural practice, dance and traditional languages, regularly representing the region and speaking at many national and international forums, and facilitating the conversation around repatriation of cultural artefacts back to their rightful place in Zenadth Kes.



BRENDAN MOON AM

Coordinator-General, National Emergency Management Authority
Brendan Moon AM commenced as the first Coordinator-General of the National Emergency Management Agency in October 2022.

Brendan brings with him extensive expertise and experience in disaster response, recovery, preparedness and risk reduction.

He spent 10 years with the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA), starting as the General Manager, Operations in 2011 until his appointment as Chief Executive Officer in 2016.

Brendan is a regular contributor to national and international dialogue on disaster risk and resilience and has addressed the United Nations Office of Disaster Risk Reduction's Asian Ministerial Conferences on multiple occasions. He is a passionate advocate for cooperation and collaboration across international, national, state and local agencies for disaster preparedness, response and recovery.



MAYOR PETER FRESHNEY

Latrobe Council

Peter Freshney has been involved in local government since 2011 and Latrobe Council Mayor since 2014.

Getting involved in local government seemed a natural progression for Peter after many years of involvement in the administration of community groups and sporting clubs.

Outside of local government commitments, Peter owns and manages a own small communications contracting business, KissTel Pty Ltd.

The business has been in operation for 18 years and is experiencing strong growth and employs 20 staff and operates statewide from Quoiba.



MAYOR SAMANTHA O'TOOLE

Balonne Shire Council

Cr Samantha O'Toole grew up in rural Canada in a farming family and began her work in Youth and Community Development. It was this passion of working with youth and small communities that lead her to study a Degree in Education prior to migrating to Australia in 2000.

She joined Balonne Shire Council for almost a decade as the Tourism and Events Officer and later Economic Development Officer.

Cr O'Toole and her partner operate Balonne Airwork and have grown it to the operation it is today over the past 16 years. During this time Sam worked as the Operations Manager.

Cr O'Toole has been instrumental in delivering ground-breaking and life changing projects across the Shire for over almost two decades, involving partners from Federal, State and Local government levels. She's passionate about rural communities and has a goal to make Balonne Shire more liveable, while providing and pursuing opportunities to ensure future generations have a positive future in the bush.



NATHAN DAL BON

CEO, National Housing Finance and Investment Corporation

Nathan Dal Bon has been Chief Executive Officer of NHFIC since its inception in 2018. He has more than 25 years' experience in economic policy development and advising across government. In his previous role as a senior Commonwealth Treasury official, he led the team that worked extensively on the establishment of NHFIC. As CEO, Nathan is focused on building an organisation that improves housing outcomes, particularly in affordable housing.

Prior to joining NHFIC, Nathan held senior executive roles in the Commonwealth Treasury, and the departments of Industry, Innovation and Science; Foreign Affairs and Trade; and Prime Minister and Cabinet. He has served as a non-executive director of the Australian Housing and Urban Research Institute (AHURI).

In 2014, Nathan was Australia's representative to the United Nations for the Report of the Intergovernmental Committee of Experts on Sustainable Development Financing.

Nathan holds a Masters in Public Administration from Harvard University and a Bachelor of Economic (Hons) degree from the University of Newcastle.
