Target of reducing deaths on our roads by 50 per cent from a 2018-2020 baseline by 2030

What are some of our biggest road safety challenges?









Behaviour – reckless drivers, speeding

Distractions – signs, tech in cars, dependence on tech, road changes

Increased traffic – more and heavier vehicles

Cost – lack of investment in road maintenance and upgrades







And how could digital innovation help overcome these safety challenges?







Digital microchip rego plates for all modes of road transport – cars, bikes, e-scooters, etc

Innovation fund for project delivery teams – designers, constructors, etc

Road user charging to fund road maintenance and upgrades







Road user charging

Fair – Applicable to all road users and all vehicle types

National – Consistent across all states and territories

Supported by the community – Achieves social licence across the country
