
28th World Gas Conference – Daegu, South Korea

- How? Scholarships recipients awarded to emerging industry leaders by the Australian Gas Industry Trust (AGIT)




ESG – What is "Environmental Sustainability"?



Environmental sustainability involves neutralising ones impacts on the environment to zero

Renewable Gas Injection & Blending

- Biomethane capture and utilization
- Gas still meets essential requirements
 - Energy Flexibility
 - High temperatures required for Industry processes
- Peak & reserve load energy demands
- Utilises biogas from large agricultural industry
- Reinforces networks with bidirectional feed
- Blend with future renewable gases





Hydrogen Injection & Fuel Cells


- Government Policy Driving Innovation










Social Case Studies - Developing Nations

Proportion of Population with primary reliance on clean fuels and technologies for cooking (%)




Household air pollution was responsible for an estimated 3.2 million deaths per year in 2020, including over 237,000 deaths of children under the age of 5

Case Study 1 – Chevron's Corporate Sustainability Report

- Chevron's Corporate Sustainability Report
- Investors have specifically stated the robustness, transparency and validity of the report informing their decision making
- Contains both quantitative & qualitative metrics designed in consultation with various stakeholders
- Independent ESG compliance auditor appointed to validate the company's reports & governance practices
- Chevron continue to advocate for a consistent ESG reporting framework for the gas industry



Case Study 2 – Nigeria's National Petroleum Company (NNPC)

- NNPC declared the 2020's as "Decade Of Gas"
- Ranked 139 out of 193 countries in United Nation's 17 Sustainable Development Goals
- Increasing difficulty to procure financial investment
- Independent, privately owned corporations being sort after
- Absent strategies fail to hold the nation accountable to ESG
- Contributes to the growing gap between developed vs. developing countries in terms of the energy trilemma
