'Assisting kids' with Ability WA's specialised equipment library



Assis Tkids Specialised Equipment Library

Ability WA's AssisTkids Equipment Library is the first of its kind in WA

Almost 100 pieces of specialised equipment for kids and families, when and where it is needed

- Strollers, activity chairs, commodes, bath chairs, manual wheelchairs, sleep and positioning equipment, powered mobility devices and communication devices available
- Accessible to WA children aged 0-7 years regardless of their funding or financial circumstances
- A 'mobility for all' approach particularly for on time powered mobility
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- Hire fees for NDIS customers apply (fees are waived if no funding)

Empowering kids to realise their abilities

Timely access to equipment without waiting for funding approvals



Multiple sizes to choose from in the majority of the available Assistive Technology (AT) with added growth capabilities



Improved developmental outcomes, independence and participation



Increased freedom, opportunity and agency



Exposure to contemporary AT options from an early age to develop skills



Reduced family stress

Reduction in abandonment of expensive AT, as it can be returned to the library and an alternate device trialled if needed





How the magic happens

- Referred via their therapists, where an Ability WA therapist with AT knowledge may be required to determine the most suitable equipment, ensuring safety, function and fit
- Hire the equipment NOW for up to 6 months, whilst waiting for NDIS funded equipment
 - Allows families to trial equipment that is not easy to access from other suppliers, prior to purchasing
 - As the child grows and develops, families can have access to alternative or additional equipment as required
 - Outcome measures set using Canadian Occupational Performance Measuring Tool (COPM-T)
 - Expected to be life changing for around 300 children and their families this year

Positive impact on families



Enables children to attend school without delay; schools may have a "no-lift policy" or lack of suitable AT, resulting in some children not attending school.



Enables community access for families and for them to be able to travel longer distances

Provides safety and stability for the child during challenging and stressful activities, such as mealtimes



Equipment does the heavy lighting - the equipment carries oxygen cylinders instead of the parents
