## Miriam Ziegler: Statement in Support of Nomination to the Board of Directors of the Mediation Standards Board Ltd

I am a solicitor, Harvard trained mediator and Family Dispute Resolution Practitioner. I started my legal career at Minter Ellison as a graduate lawyer and then transitioned to mediation in 2006 after being selected as one of only four community positions to train in mediation at Harvard Law School. Following completion of this course, as well as the Harvard Program in Negotiation, I practiced as a Harvard mediator in District Courts throughout Boston.

I returned to Sydney in 2007 where I have continued my mediation work since. I have been fortunate to practice in a variety of settings including private practice and community organisations. I designed and continue to teach the Negotiation and Dispute Resolution Workshop in Practical Legal Training Program at the University of New South Wales.

I am also aware of the discrepancy in the professional standards required of mediators and solicitors.
