- 1. The NSW Context: We will examine the context of NSW public secondary schools, with a particular focus on how SPC has influenced key elements of the NSW Education Reform Agenda over the last decade.
- 2. Diversity of Leadership: Our membership profile is broad. Our members a drawn from a vast range of contexts and have a wide range of needs. We will provide an overview of the gender, social and cultural diversity of our members and our schools. We will discuss how our association meets the needs of principals in comprehensive high schools, multi-campus colleges, selective high schools, central schools, Schools for Specific Purposes, Environmental Education Centres and Educational Training Units.
- 3. Supporting Sustainable Leadership: We will examine the structure of NSW SPC and explore its role in supporting principal wellbeing, through our employed officers, our annual principal wellbeing survey and our affiliation with professional and academic partners.
- 4. Preparing leaders of the future: NSW SPC coordinates a significant suite of Professional Learning to meet the needs of our members, to build leadership capacity and to prepare the next generation of school leaders. We will provide an overview of our Annual Conference, regular Professional Learning Days, and the structures and personnel that we have put in place to ensure the quality of these programs.
