Walkability is


A reason to walk, the mixed use neighbourhood (includes a food shop, a school, a workplace, a park and other activities that occur every day)

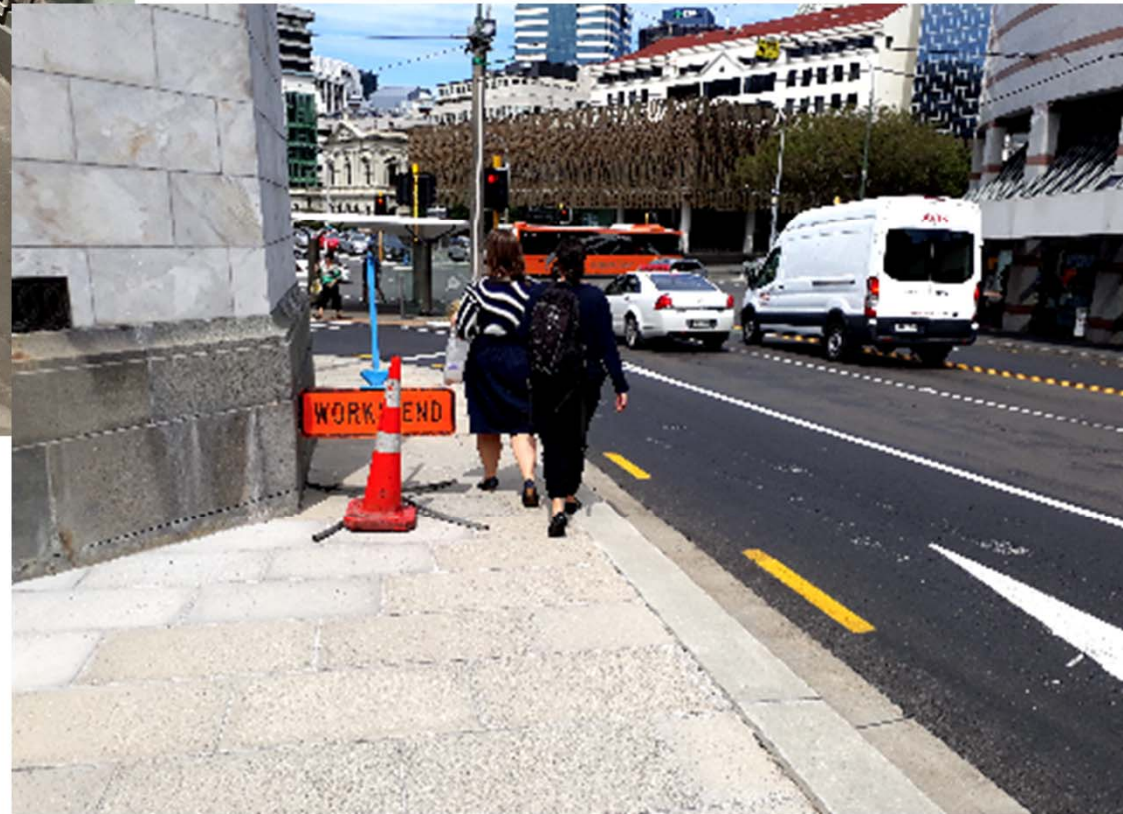

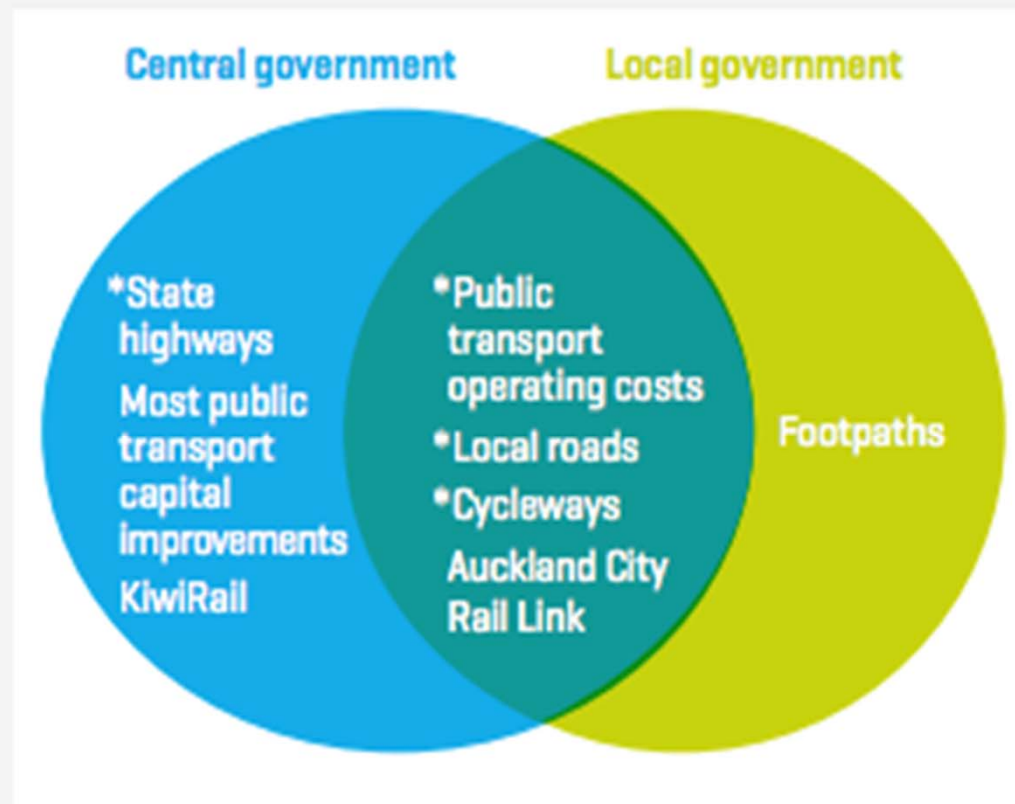
