General comment/s	The Journey to Pave a better future fo Māori on our Roads.		
<b>Presentation overview</b> (250 words maximum) Te Ara Haepapa is Auckland Transport's Māori Road Safety Programme. It is Auckland Transport's reponse to Auckland Councils Te Toa Takitini framework. Māori in Tāmaki Makaurau have the highest Death and Serious Injury rate for all age groups compared to their non- Maori counterparts combined. Māori make up 10% of the population and 15% of death and serious injuries. Te Aara Haepapa engages with			

the 19 Manawhenua iwi and Mataawaka within Tāmaki Makaurau through iwi, hapū, community groups, Kura Kaupapa Māori, Wharekura, Kohanga Reo and whanau groups. Te ara Haepapa aims to raise the awareness of Māori road safety issues and work with whanau in the direction they believe is a priority for their area through education and by finding practical solutions. I will showcase some of the resources we have developed in Te Reo Māori, Reo Rua or Reo Tauiwi on various road safety themes (e.g.Kaihautū - Raihana Ākonga) that will assist our Rangatahi and whanau in Kohanga reo, Kura kaupapa Maori and wharekura for whom English is a second language.
