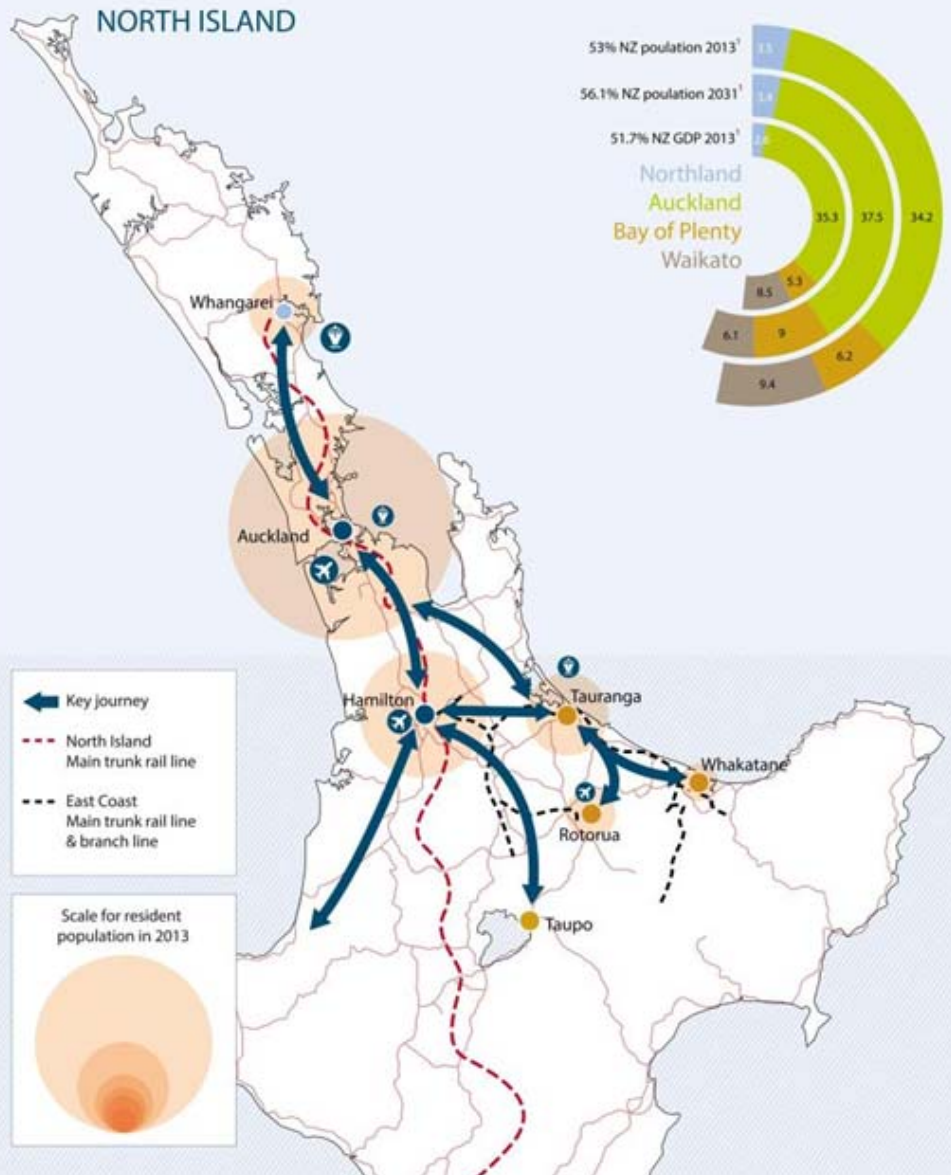
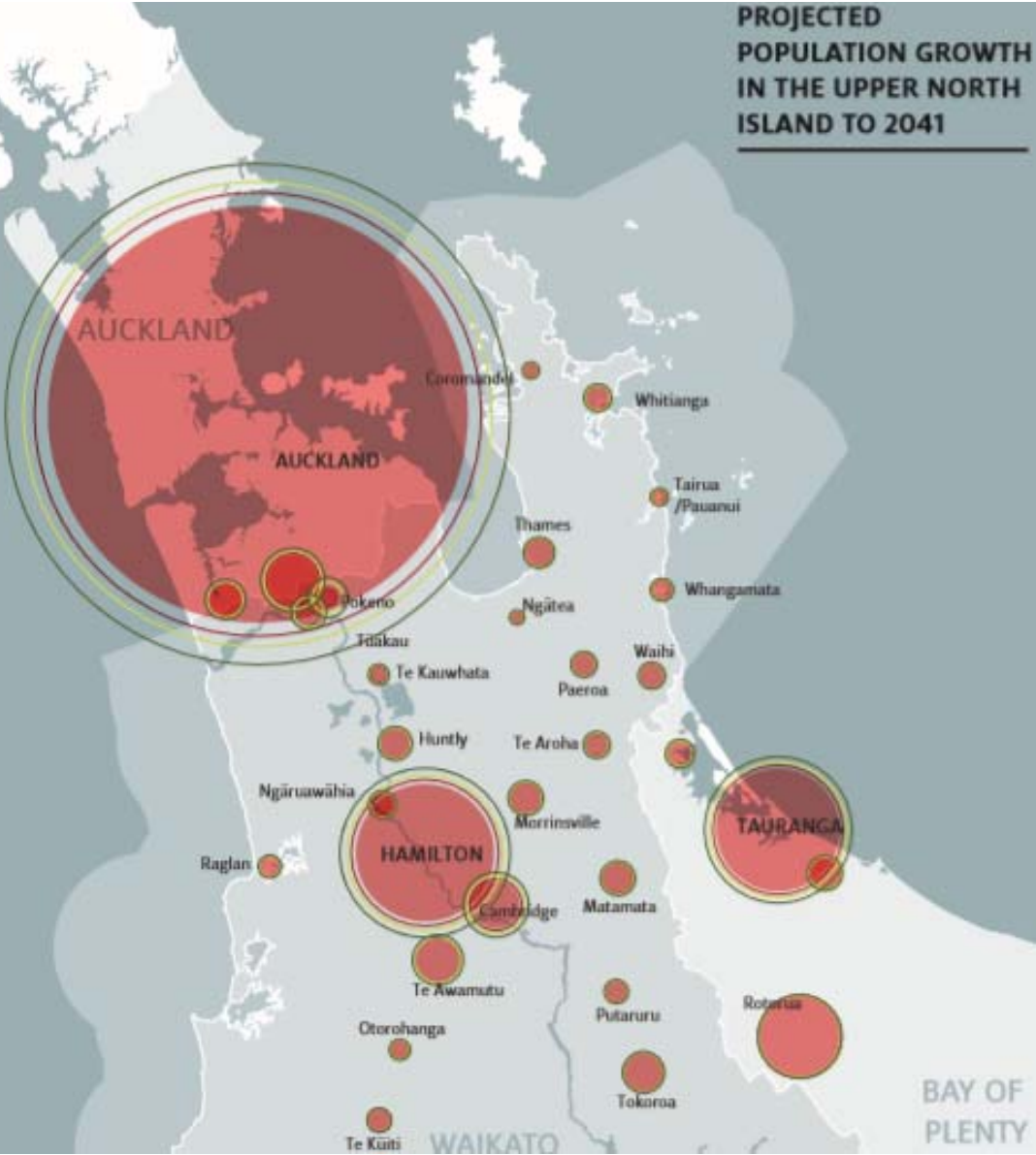








**PROJECTED

IN THE UPPER NORTH ISLAND TO 2041**











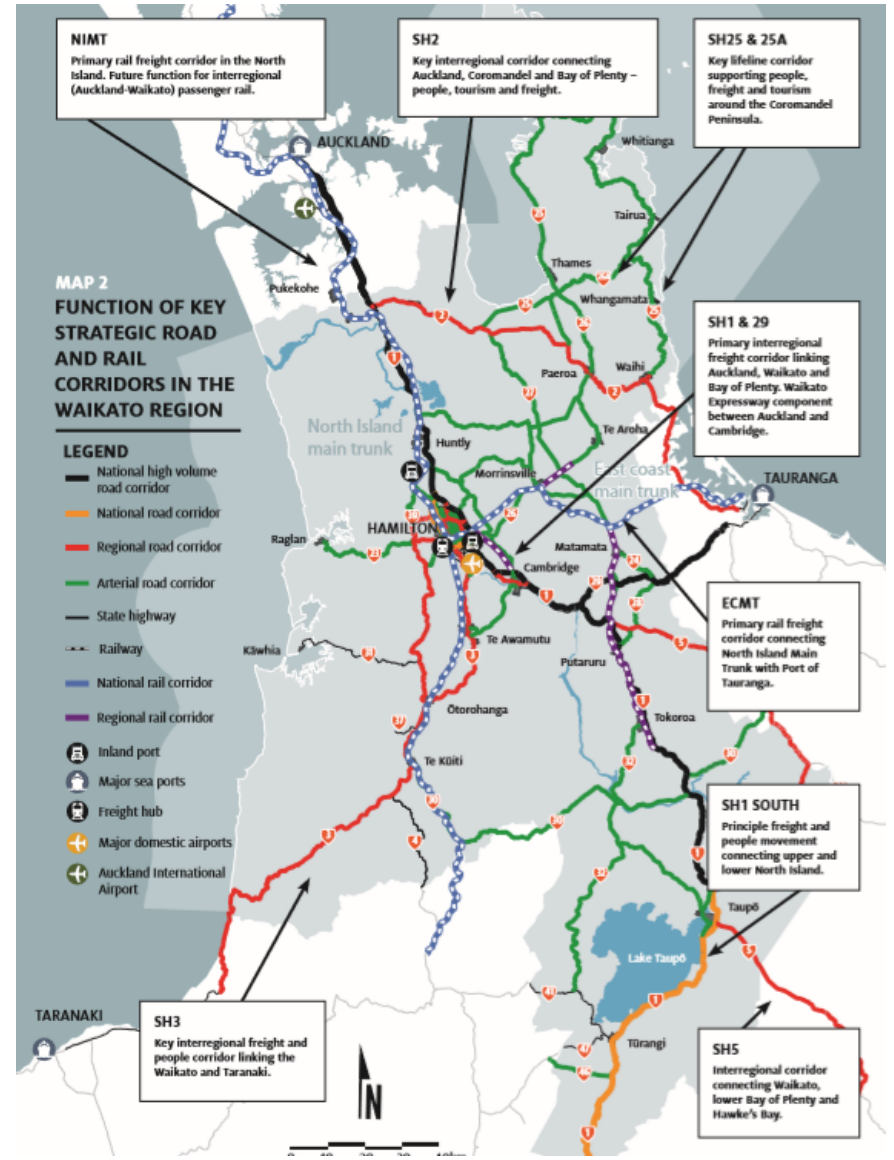
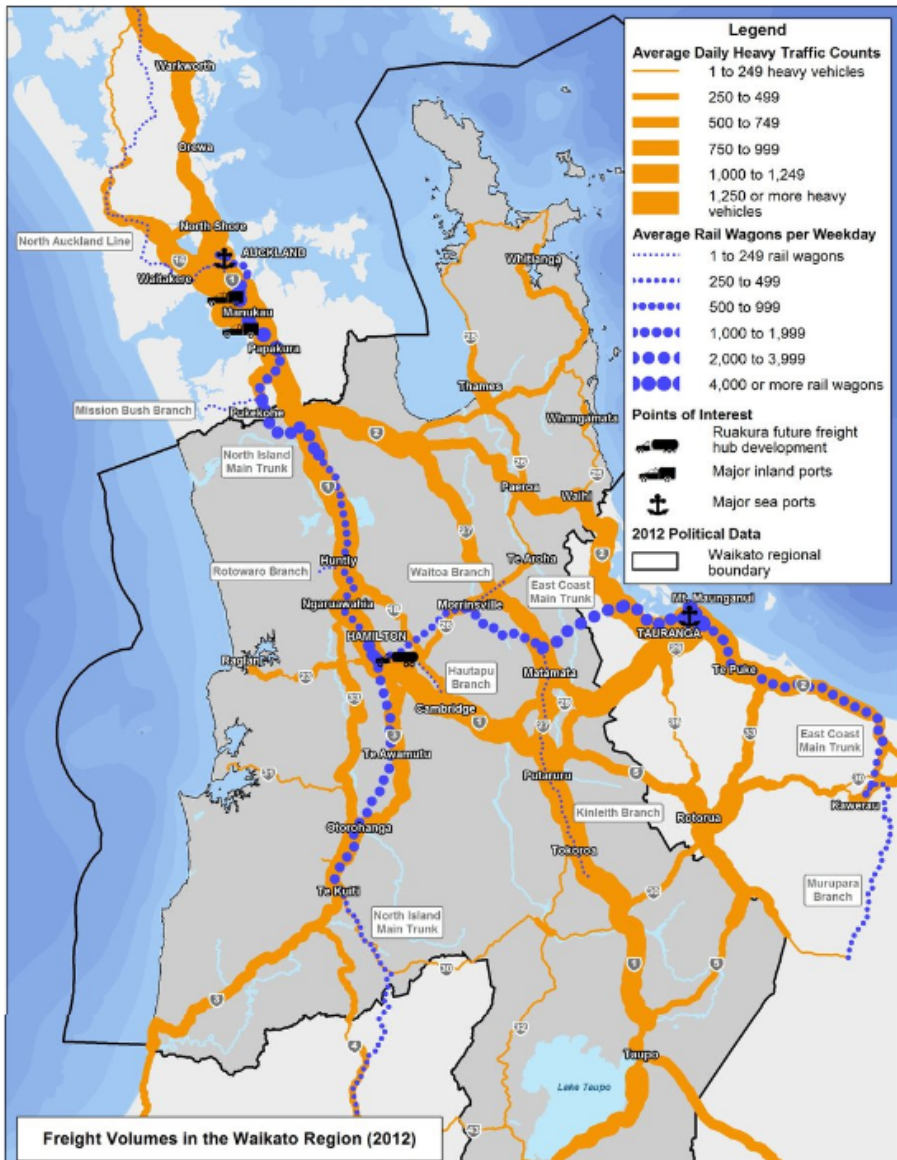




Waikato Road Fatalities – 12 months

- › Highest number of deaths
- › Second highest number of deaths and serious injuries
- › 72 people killed
- › Around 364 seriously injured

24% of death and serious injury crashes are speed related.



15% of urban casualties are cyclists.



Motorcyclists are involved in **20 – 25%** of death and serious injury crashes (crash risk is 18 times higher than cars).



Alcohol or drug impaired drivers make up **25%** of death and serious injury crashes.



14 – 25% of urban road related casualties are pedestrians.



Up to **15%** of death and serious injury crashes involve people not wearing seatbelts or helmets.



Vision

Working together towards zero deaths and serious injuries on Waikato's roads.

Purpose

1. To identify short term priorities for the next three years for road safety partners, and to inform the review of the 2018 Regional Land Transport Plan road safety priorities.
2. To provide signals for longer term priorities that could influence road safety culture change and a step change in road safety outcomes for the region.



Key short term priorities 2017-2021

- **Leadership, collaboration and accountability**
 - Re-establish the Regional Road Safety Forum as a key driver and champion of road safety change and education in the region and inter-regionally.
- **Safe Speeds: Speed management**
- **Safe Road Use: High risk road users**





















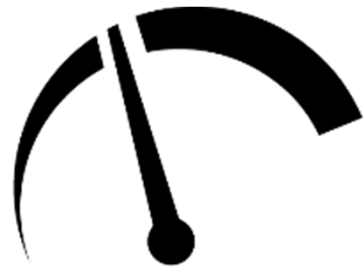
