




Mode of transport to get to Henderson Station


Mode used to access station


This is Henderson




It currently has traffic going everywhere.

- 2. Create a more vibrant town centre Colour, artwork, local stories and a focus on Henderson as a Place







Intervention Prioritisation

Co-Design Results



Item	Advisory Group Support Rating	Priority Ranking
Install/upgrade safe Zebra Crossings	100%	1
Trial a traffic circulation plan – "go round not through"	98%	2
Intersection artwork 'ground mural' on Great North Road (drive on)	98%	3
Shared lane artwork (cycle on)	96%	4
Formalise a Pedestrian Barnes Dance with 'Count-down' Crossing Lights	94%	5
Install safe shared mobility lanes	92%	6
Volunteer painted planters & separators	86%	7
Pop-Up Parklet & tables for Outdoor dining	70%	8






Waharua kopito

Waharua kōpito consists of vertically paired diamond shapes. The literal translation is 'a point where people or events cross'. The pattern is a reminder that change occurs at such meeting points.
