A structured approach to assessing suitability of interventions



Efficient & consistent efforts to assess interventions



Framework, standards & domain model required



Structuring evidence on

- Costs
- Transferability
- Effectiveness

# Project approach

## Step 1 Identify requirements for cataloguing interventions – frameworks, metadata standards, domain models

- a) Desktop review of existing catalogues
- b) Desktop review of best practice for catalogue and evidence standards
- c) Identify stakeholder and user needs for cataloguing

## Step 2: Design and test prototype

- a) Draft design – framework, standards, digital interface
- b) User test
- c) Revise and validate

## Step 3: Recommend measures that might be employed in Aotearoa

- a) Steering group workshop

## Stakeholder input: What features, functions, & qualities would make a catalogue work for you?

### Desired evidence standards

- Searchable structure and language – vocabulary & information
- Robustness and quality of sources - methodologies
- Clarity
- Relevance to NZ transport context
- Content – broad range of outcomes & interventions

### Features, functions, qualities

- Coping with multiple disciplines and technical language
- Shareable outputs
- Make visible current evidence gaps
- Connections within the catalogue
- Connections to wider evidence bases

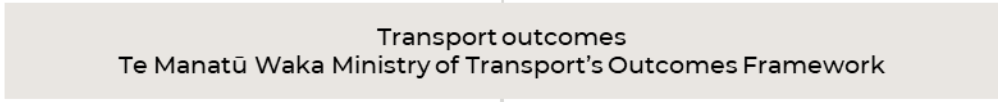
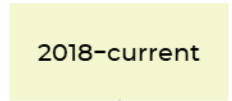
# Framework design for CETI (Catalogue of Evidence for Transport Interventions)

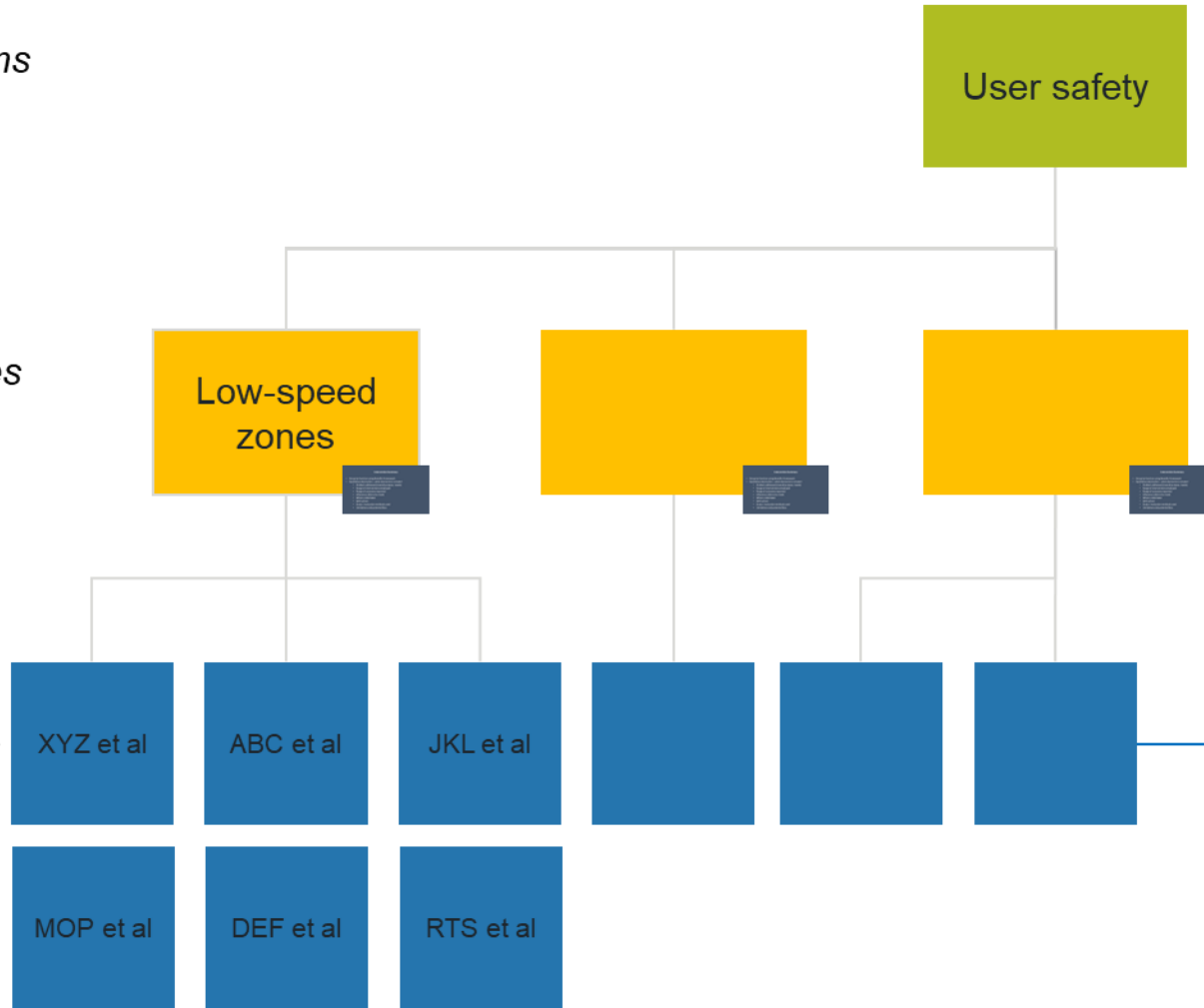

**Available filters to filter sources by intervention type**

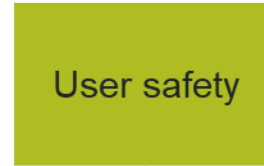
- Changes to ... (the intervention function)
- Type of intervention or change
- System level
- Costs
- Time scale
- Geographic scale
- Mode
- Context
- Urbanicity and multi-modal maturity
- Observed changes
- Intervention outcomes

Available filters to filter sources by type

- Citation details
- Type of source
- Type of data
- SMS rating
- Type of assessment

# Standards & harmonising



## Harmonising - *making inferences across diverse sources*

### Filters-based:

Standardising definitions across non-identical sources to create a cohesive database.

- Evidence standards
- metadata

### Features, functions, qualities

Harmonising Evidence Heuristic

# CETI filters – source details & quality

## Phase 1: Realist review questions (content extracted from the CETI)

What inferences can I confidently take from these sources about my problem?

AA  
intervention  
did BB...

in given  
context CC...

which led to  
changes DD...

that produced  
outcome EE

## Phase 2: Sense-making questions (experience, complementary information, judgement)

What other  
information is  
useful?

How plausible is it?

How confident can I  
be?

## Phase 3: Expert judgement and conclusion

I have more/less confidence that AA intervention will achieve EE outcome in my context

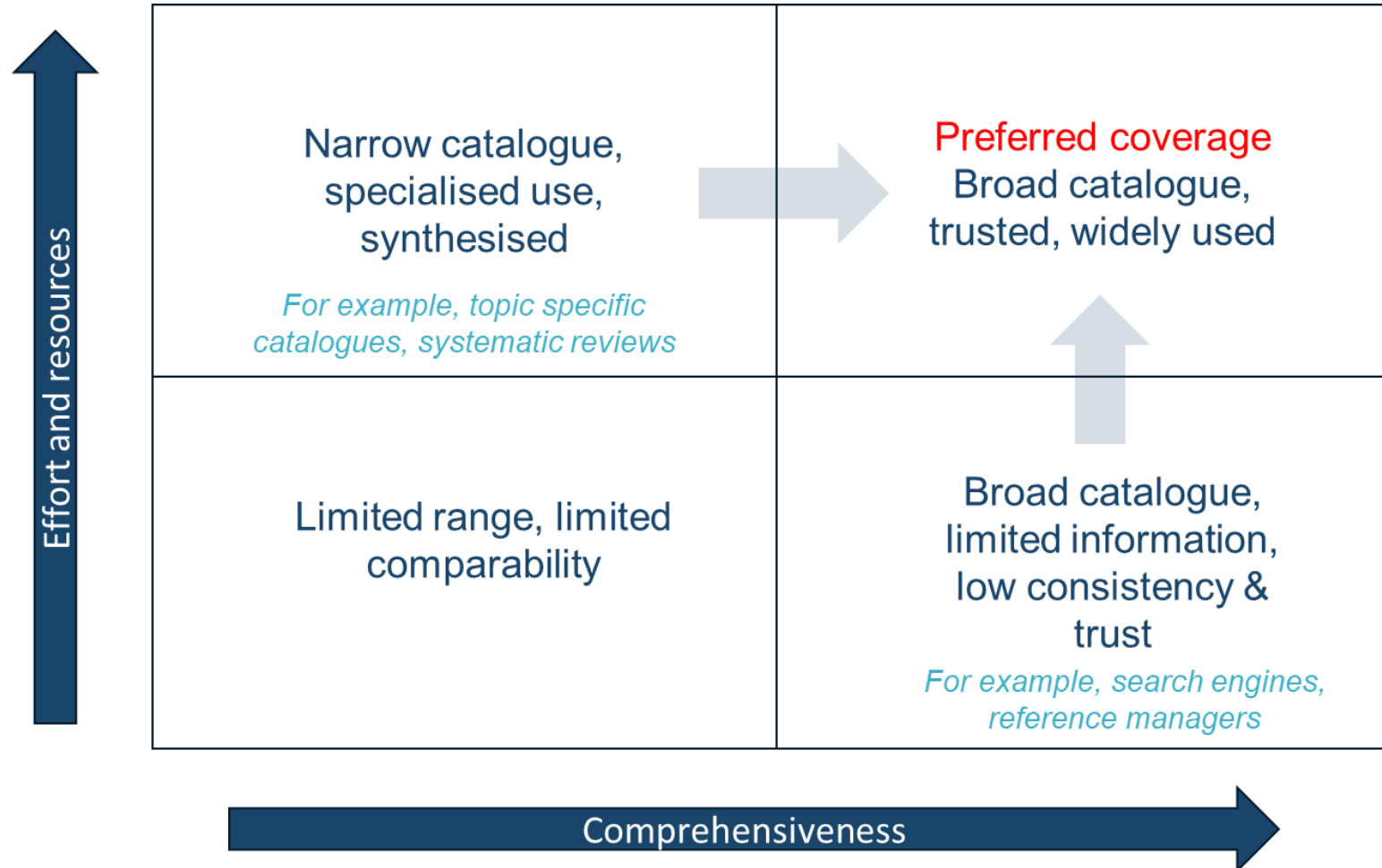
