



Christchurch - A Place for Everyone

Christchurch has been provided with a golden opportunity to improve its transport network to meet the current and future needs of all travellers across a range of different modes of travel. To achieve this, Christchurch is undertaking a programme of transport projects that will create a network which makes it easy, safe and enjoyable to move around and that will prioritise the city for people. The goals are to:

- Create more options about how people travel whether by car, public transport, cycle, walking or other while also ensuring we all share the street network
- Prioritise some routes to protect more vulnerable road users while making it easy for cars and buses to get where they need to go. Some areas will be shared zones.
- Improve access to transport networks allowing people to undertake journeys when they want and how they want
- Improve reliability for all travellers
- Ensure the areas around the travel networks (roads, footpaths and cycleways) are greener and more enjoyable for people to spend more time in
- Create a safe and healthy community that supports healthy lifestyles, creates a sense of place, and provides for safe journeys
- Protect and enhance the natural and built environment

To achieve this Christchurch City Council is spending \$1.077 billion on transport projects in the next 10 years.
