Sue Adams is the co-leader (tangata Tiriti) of the national Nurse Practitioner (NP) and Enrolled Nurse (EN) workforce programme, University of Auckland. Her areas of expertise include development of the nursing workforce in primary health care, models of care and services to promote social justice and health equity. Sue's work and research critiques the institutional structures and policies governing our health system and workforce, with the intent of increasing the visibility of nursing and our contribution to the nation's health.
