



DRIVING EXCELLENCE IN PALLIATIVE CARE EDUCATION

The Cancer and Palliative Care Outcomes Centre, through the Palliative Care Education and Training Collaborative and ELDAC, leads the translation of research into national education initiatives that strengthen Australia's palliative care workforce. By aligning with health priorities and engaging diverse communities, it ensures training is accessible, evidence-based, and culturally responsive.





Performance & Impact Highlights 2024/25

- PEPA placement target exceeded by 71% (target: 300, actual: 512)
- 1,005 Aged Care worker participants attending 89 placements across 71 sites.
- 57% of our workshops delivered in regional + rural areas
- 98% of employers report improved staff skills
- 100% of host sites report positive placement experience
- 100% of participants found placements useful

Performance & Impact Highlights 2024/25

- Community engagement target exceeded by 150% (target: 16, actual: 40)
- Regular IPEPA Yarns to support the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Palliative Care workforce
- Collaborations developing cultural responsive community led resource development
- 574 enrolled users of the IPEPA/PCC4U First Nations Toolkit to train the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workforce
- 227 participants attended cultural responsive IPEPA Workshops





performance & Impact Highlights 2024/25

PCC4U



- 26,111 university graduates reached
- 9,339 VET sector graduates reached
- 93% of university courses implementing or reviewing PCC4U resources
- 97% academics report usefulness of PCC4U resources
- 98% of RTOs delivering Diploma of Nursing are implementing or reviewing the PCC4U learning resources
- 8,789 PalliBytes microlearning module completions

Performance & Impact Highlights 2024/25

- 198,496 website visits
- 2,759 participants in education activities
- 98% of users gained greater knowledge, confidence and skills in delivering palliative care through the Knowledge Hub
- 99,986 users and 181,510 views across 8 toolkits
- 127 aged care services engaged in Linkages projects
- 900 inclusive care guides distributed to support palliative care for diverse and underserved populations
