## CBAA Conference 2025 Scholarship Terms & Conditions

1. Scholarship Inclusions

The CBAA Scholarship covers:

- Full conference registration, including access to workshops, panels, and catering (morning tea, afternoon tea, and lunch).
- A ticket to both the Welcome Drinks and the CBAA Community Broadcasting Awards Gala Dinner.
- Accommodation at the Crowne Plaza Hobart for three nights (check-in: Thursday, 23 October 2025; check-out: Sunday, 26 October 2025), including daily breakfast.
- Flight costs up to a maximum of \$400.
- 2. Travel & Accommodation Arrangements
  - Scholarship recipients are responsible for booking their own flights and will be reimbursed up to \$400 upon providing valid receipts.
  - Travel insurance is not covered by the scholarship, and recipients are encouraged to arrange their own.
  - Accommodation is booked by CBAA. Recipients will be provided with a private room unless otherwise specified.
  - Any additional nights outside the scholarship period must be booked and paid for by the recipient.
  - Guests are not permitted to stay in the funded accommodation unless arranged and paid for separately by the recipient.
  - Recipients are responsible for any incidental hotel charges (e.g., minibar, room service, damages).
- 3. Conference Participation Requirements
  - Scholarship recipients must attend all three days of the conference and are expected to actively participate in sessions.
  - Recipients may be asked to attend networking events or media opportunities to represent their station and the scholarship program.
  - If a recipient is unable to attend a session due to unforeseen circumstances, they must inform CBAA staff.
- 4. Additional Costs & Responsibilities
  - Recipients are responsible for any costs beyond the scholarship and \$400 flight allowance, including:
    - Flight costs exceeding the allowance.
    - Transfers to and from the airport.
    - Meals outside of the conference catering.
    - Any personal expenses.

- 5. Code of Conduct & Behaviour Expectations
  - All scholarship recipients must adhere to the CBAA Code of Conduct.
  - Any behaviour that is disruptive, discriminatory, or in violation of the code may result in forfeiture of the scholarship, removal from the conference, and/or reimbursement of scholarship funds to CBAA.
- 6. Cancellation & No-Show Policy
  - If a recipient is unable to attend, they must notify CBAA at least 21 days before the conference to allow the scholarship to be reallocated.
  - Recipients who cancel after this period may be required to reimburse non-refundable expenses incurred on their behalf.
  - If a recipient does not attend the conference without prior notice, they may be ineligible for future CBAA scholarships.
- 7. Scholarship Eligibility
  - o Scholarships are available for up to five individuals, divided as follows:
    - Individuals in leadership positions at their stations.
    - Broadcasters, producers, or presenters.
  - Preference will be given to applicants who meet one or more of the following criteria:
    - Are under the age of 26.
    - Identify as an underrepresented gender.
    - Are affiliated with a station in a regional, rural, or remote area.
    - Represent a station that did not attend the 2024 CBAA Conference, with their attendance likely to benefit their home station.
- 8. General Eligibility Requirements To apply for the scholarship, applicants must:
  - Be a board/committee member, employee, or volunteer at a community radio station that:
    - holds a temporary or permanent community radio license, and
    - is a CBAA member.
  - o Be an Australian citizen, permanent resident, or holder of a humanitarian visa.
  - Have the approval of their station to attend. (Only one scholarship will be awarded per station.)
- 9. Post-Conference Obligations
  - Scholarship recipients may be required to submit a testimonial or short reflection on their experience at the conference for promotional and funding purposes.
  - Recipients may also be asked to participate in a post-event survey to help improve the scholarship program.
