



IHC will advocate for the rights, inclusion and welfare of all people with intellectual disabilities and support them to live satisfying lives in the community. Stand Tall began when the IHC Library noticed there wasn't a lot of information on managing money, specifically for young New Zealanders with intellectual disabilities or neurodiversity. With the support from The Holdsworth Charitable Trust, the library started to investigate creating a resource to support people to become more independent. Developing a game looked like the best way to create a resource that would be fun and help people learn. IHC joined forces with InGame and worked together on different scenarios and designs until this fun game was ready to play. Stand Tall was first presented and tested at a workshop as a board game before it was developed into an online game. The game testers came together to test what is involved with living independently. Once the board game was finalised the online prototype of the game was developed and tested among the same testers. IHC is still working with InGame to create further scenarios and continuing to make changes to keep Stand Tall up to date. At the beginning of the game, you can create an Avatar and decide the best look for you. From there you face many scenarios that reflect living in a flat for example, how much money do you need for groceries? How are you going to remember your chores? Are you going to call the landlord about the broken shelf? All these questions come with three choices, all of which impacts your Avatar's financial, physical and emotional health in negative or positive ways, just like in real life. The scenarios in Stand Tall are realistic example of events that can happen in a shared flat. Stand Tall is suitable for students and people transitioning from school or moving to a more independent lifestyle. Stand Tall is completely FREE and available to download on the Google Play Store or Apple App Store.

Equality for the Ageing: Ensuring Access to Assistive Technology for the Aged Care Population

Global census and survey data tells us that the world population is not only growing, but also living longer due to improved access to health services and medical and technological advances. Research also confirms that the use of assistive technology is highly effective at improving functional abilities, reducing the risk for costly medical complications, and reducing caregiver burden. However, despite these known benefits, a gap remains between access to assistive technology for younger people as compared to access given for the ageing population. Attitudinal biases exist among certain medical teams and funding agencies regarding the needs of the older adult regarding assistive technology.

This presentation will examine the current approach to power mobility access for older adults with functional impairments related to the ageing process in New Zealand; take a focused look at power mobility and seating and positioning for the ageing person with disability, and will present research-based best practice recommendations for clinical application.

Yi is a Chinese who has lived in New Zealand for 20 years. This is a personal story but everyone can relate to. When Yi became disabled after contracted Polio at the age of two. How Yi's mother determined her future to thrive and enabled she travelled the world and then settled in New Zealand. Later, Yi became a mother for a girl, who was diagnosed with intellectual disability when she was born.

Yi's journey with her daughter, cultural shock on how to define the disability. How she adapt to Kiwi culture for supporting her half Chinese half Kiwi disabled daughter, and overcome whatever the life throw to her. She keeps optimistic and enthusiastic.

Yi advocates for herself and her daughter, raising the awareness by speaking on disability rights for other disabled people and whānau.

New Zealand disability community is dedicating to lead better lives by embracing the Enabling Good Lives Principles. In her presentation Yi will focus on how to practice for the better lives of herself and her daughter beyond her Chinese and Kiwi cultures, adapt the change, build resilience through self-determination on the mana of EGL principles.

We will explore the research available to assist in our decision making and ensure we use outcome measures that showcase client centered processes aren't lost in a tick box society.

Upcycling in Tonga

Jacqueline Abel and Sue Fairhall

Have you ever wondered what happens to donated or equipment that cannot be reissued in New Zealand? Since 2005, Altus Pacific Aid has collaborated with several Pacific Island communities to provide complex wheeled mobility, postural seating and lying solutions. The COVID-19 pandemic disrupted annual mobility clinics in Tonga, rendering much of the previously donated equipment unreliable or beyond repair and in dire need of replacement.

Altus Pacific Aid partners with the Mango Tree Centre in Tonga, which networks with the local disabled community there. The Centre hosts annual wheelchair and seating clinics, where assessors and technicians from NZ refurbish and upcycle donated mobility equipment for those in need.

This presentation will highlight the recent volunteer work completed at the wheelchair and seating clinic in Nuku' alofa, Tonga (2023/ 2024) and comment on future goals for wheelchair and seating clinics and other aspects of work done by Altus.

11.15am -12.00pm MND: Maintaining independence through power mobility.

Deb Wilson and Helen Lappin

Motor Neurone Disease (MND), is a progressive neuro-degenerative disease affecting the motor neurones of the brain and spine. The prevalence in New Zealand is thought to be higher than the international average with approximately 400 people living with MND at any one time. Symptoms can include muscle weakness, spasticity, fasciculations and atrophy which progress throughout the course of the disease. Symptoms can initially present as stumbling or foot drop, difficulties with swallowing or speech, reduced dexterity and/or weak grip, and less commonly breathing problems or behavioural and cognitive changes.

In addition to supporting mobility and participation, early access to power mobility is an important strategy for muscle preservation. This session will review MND symptoms at onset and the importance of understanding the likely progression when selecting a power mobility device, alternative drive control options and programming parameters to accommodate for future changes.

Whether you were the original prescriber or have just met the client conducting regular seating and wheelchair reviews can be complex with psychosocial, best-practice, time-restraints, and cost considerations. If then, you hear the dreaded "it isn't working" relating to a cushion, wheelchair or even a key accessory, it can be overwhelming to know what to do.

Join us as we explore the when, the why and the how of wheelchair reviews to empower the user to maximise their AT outcome. We will also explore the importance of wheelchair reviews, including the frequency and key things to look out for.

2.00pm - Considering Cushion Selection – How can we use ISO testing data to assist in the process.

ISO Cushion standards are based on objective, scientific laboratory analysis of support surfaces. These tests measure the critical characteristics of wheelchair cushions. Can these tests contribute to evidence based practice to assist in the clinical reasoning processes when determining potential solutions?

How can this standardised, lab-based data be considered along with the needs and goals of the individual? What else do we need to consider when identifying cushion most appropriate for an individual users? Come along and join us in this session where we will deep dive into the concepts and uses of ISO testing to support clinical reasoning.

Considerations for robust power wheelchair prescription

Prescribing a power wheelchair requires assessing the user's environment to ensure optimal mobility and safety. Key factors include indoor vs. outdoor use, where indoor wheelchairs need excellent maneuverability, a small turning radius, and compatibility with various floor surfaces. Outdoor wheelchairs must be durable, with good suspension, stability, and long battery life. Terrain type influences the need for robust features like larger wheels for rough surfaces. Accessibility considerations include home compatibility with ramps and doorways and community access via public transportation. The user's lifestyle, activities, and weather conditions dictate additional features for work, school, recreation, and allweather use. Storage and transportability are essential, considering ease of disassembly and storage space. Physical and cognitive abilities require appropriate control systems and support, while battery life and convenient charging are crucial for daily use. Maintenance, warranty, and local service availability ensure long-term reliability. These factors make power wheelchair selection more relevant to the client experience and will be discussed during this session to assist therapists with power wheelchair prescription.

10.00am - Artificial Intelligence Training for Disabled People and 10.45am Allies

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is changing the world. It has the potential to reduce inequality or massively increase inequality. The outcome will depend on how educated disabled people and allies are on how to use and not use AI.

Al can be useful for disabled people in various ways, such as providing a personal assistant, increasing productivity at work, helping with communication, and automating smart homes. Al can enable people with disabilities to access information, services, and opportunities that would otherwise be inaccessible or difficult to use. Al can also empower people with disabilities to express their creativity, preferences, and opinions.

Al is very powerful and can be used for good, but it can also be dangerous. Disabled people, and allies in the disability sector need to be aware of how it can affect your life negatively to be able to get the most out of it. Knowing about the potential downsides of Al helps people make smart choices about using Al, guides the creation of rules to keep Al safe and fair, and helps prevent harm. Additionally, it prepares us to handle job changes caused by Al and ensures that Al benefits everyone equally, not just a few. Overall, understanding Al's negative impacts helps us use this technology in ways that are good for society and fair to everyone.

We will talk about the law around reasonable accommodations for disability, and explore the options available to people who feel they have been discriminated against, including how both Auckland Disability Law and the Human Rights Commission can help.

Considering both approaches of early intervention and planning for challenging postures with the practical implications, let's take a closer look at supported standing and its importance in promoting function, participation, and health for all.

Tim Young


