This cherished mode of transport, favoured by tourists and locals, offers an effortlessly delightful tour around the city's charismatic spots, weaving through traffic and providing a unique perspective on Penang's vibrant heritage.

➤ The Pinang Peranakan Mansion in Georgetown, Penang, is a beautifully restored museum that offers a glimpse into the lavish lifestyle and rich heritage of the Peranakan Chinese, also known as the Straits Chinese or Baba-Nyonya. The mansion showcases the opulence and unique culture of this community, which emerged from the blending of Chinese and local Malay influences during the British colonial period.





Khoo Kongsi in Georgetown, Penang, is a magnificent clan house that stands as a testament to the grandeur and history of the Khoo family, one of the prominent Chinese clans in Malaysia. This meticulously preserved structure offers visitors a glimpse into the lavish lifestyle, architectural beauty, and deep-rooted traditions of the Khoo clan.

➤ The Clan Jetties in Georgetown, Penang, are a unique and fascinating cultural heritage site, consisting of traditional Chinese water villages built on stilts along the coastline. These jetties were established by Chinese immigrants who arrived in Penang during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Each jetty is named after a Chinese clan, and the area serves as a living reminder of Penang's Chinese settler history.





➤ Street Art: Street Art in Penang has become one of the island's most iconic attractions, especially within the streets of Georgetown. This art movement started in 2012 and has since grown into a defining feature of the city, blending contemporary creativity with Penang's rich historical and cultural backdrop.
