# 1. Context and rationale for change

#### Heavy vehicle crash risks are high.

#### Heavy vehicles' size brings inherent risks

- Size and mass (momentum/energy) affect crash outcomes
- For buses, passenger numbers increase consequences

#### Heavy vehicles have an exposure risk

- Make up 9% of all VKT (15% of fatal crashes)
- Often light vehicle driver error

Fortunately, heavy vehicle drivers are more experienced and safer than the average driver



# 1. Context and rationale for change

The objective is to reduce road trauma. There are three key problems and one important consideration.

#### Problems with the current system

- 1. Licensing is not focused on key risks
- 2. Training quality affected by governance arrangements
- 3. Driver licensing is inconsistent across Australia

#### Consideration for the future system

Changes to licensing should not compromise:

- the availability of professional drivers
- the use of higher productivity vehicles, or
- · reasonable access to licences for personal use




## 2. The approach to the review

# The goal is to deliver a nationally-consistent framework for heavy vehicle driver licensing.

Austroads has worked with jurisdictions, industry and others to:

- create an 'exemplar framework'
- from that, develop a set of workable changes
- analyse the regulation impacts and consult broadly:
  - Consultation Regulation Impact Statement (C-RIS)
  - video explainers
  - fact sheets/FAQs
  - presentations, webinars and podcasts.
- finalise a refined package for agreement and implementation.




## 3. Changes under consideration - drivers

# The review aims to increase the number of safe and job-ready drivers.

- Enhanced driver competencies
- Affective state (attitudinal) considerations to complement technical skills
- HC as a prerequisite for MC class licence
- New progression options that recognise training and experience.



## 3. Changes under consideration - drivers



### 3. Changes under consideration - driver trainers

The review aims to improve the quality and oversight of driver training.

- Minimum training course requirements
- On-line learning options
- Improved governance arrangements.



### 4. Next steps

# If approved, there will be practical considerations.

Australia's transport ministers are currently considering the proposed changes. If agreed, Austroads will:

- present the results
- work with state and territory driver licensing authorities to develop implementation plans
- coordinate consultation with operators and trainers
- update ITSOC on progress
- support implementation of the new framework
