Yanchep National Park TREES ADVENTURE | CAVING

4-12 YEAR OLDS



Time 8.30am-5.15pm

Cost \$30.00 per child – includes private bus transport, morning/afternoon tea, lunch and all activities

Parents welcome, but not compulsory

Yanchep National Park is a 50-minute drive from Perth's CBD where you will spend the full day.

To start the day, the group will participate in Yanchep's Tree Adventure swinging, climbing and leaping through the trees.

There are fun and challenging obstacle courses in the tree canopy ranging from low easy courses for mini adventurers to 10-metre high courses for the adrenaline junkies. Using world-class interlocking safety systems, kids will be attached by harness to the course at all times.

In the afternoon, children can register for one of two caving options:

Option 1 – Adventure Caving

Strictly 8 years+ | Limited places available

Join expert guides as they crawl, climb and slide their way through wild caves in an environment where the only light source is a torch! Be amazed at the fascinating formations and take the challenge to make this an underground experience never to be forgotten.

Option 2 – Crystal Cave

4 years+

Experience an underground wonderland full of natural cave decorations such as the 'jewelled city' and other stalactites and stalagmites. The experienced guide will lead you through Perth's only tourist cave, which has access to stairs and paths, and low lights within the cave making it family friendly.
