



# National Critical Care and Trauma Response Centre (NCCTRC)

The National Critical Care and Trauma Response Centre (NCCTRC) is a key component of the Australian Government's health emergency preparedness and response capability. Through strategic partnerships, education, training and research, the Centre delivers clinical and academic leadership in trauma, critical care and disaster health response.

A core element of the NCCTRC's capacity to respond quickly and effectively is the coordination and delivery of the Australian Medical Assistance Team (AUSMAT), a multidisciplinary healthcare team deployed in response to national and international health emergencies.

This ensures Australia maintains a readily deployable workforce and a fully equipped, rapidly deployable field hospital, including inpatient, surgical, resuscitation and outpatient capability.

The NCCTRC's multidisciplinary Trauma Service, based at Royal Darwin Hospital, provides holistic specialist care for trauma patients and delivers a comprehensive education program across the Northern Territory, including in remote communities.

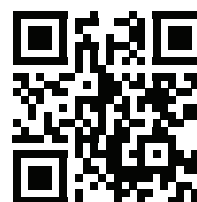

# Ready to build your trauma response skills?

Explore our range of trauma and disaster management courses and register today to strengthen your capability in challenging and resource-limited environments. Clinical training opportunities are available throughout the Northern Territory and Far North Western Australia.

## **Remote Prehospital Trauma and Disaster Course** (2-days) \$300-\$600

This course is for personnel who are required to attend major trauma events in remote settings. It has a strong focus on road scene safety, scene management and safe patient extrication from motor vehicles, while reinforcing the fundamental principles of trauma care. The course also incorporates mass-casualty and disaster management principles, including a dedicated scenario in which participants can apply and adapt these concepts to the challenges of a remote environment.

## **Remote Area Trauma Course** (One day), Free, supported by NCCTRC

Designed for clinicians working in remote settings who are required to manage patients, often with potentially severe injuries, for prolonged periods prior to retrieval. Through theoretical knowledge and practical skills, the course equips participants with the fundamental principles of trauma care, structured around the C-ABCDE approach, to optimise patient outcomes in resource-limited and time-critical environments.

## **Australian Trauma Team Training** (One day) \$115-\$130

A multi-professional, multidisciplinary simulation-based course that develops teamwork and clinical practice skills relevant to trauma management. The course focuses on behavioural skills essential to effective trauma teamwork, including leadership, crisis management, communication, negotiation, conflict resolution and safety culture. Participants will develop these skills through short lectures, interactive 'pause and discuss' scenarios and immersive simulations, allowing them to practise decision-making, team coordination and communication strategies.
