Early in 1998, a number of head and neck oncologists from the disciplines of surgery, radiation oncology and medical oncology met in Sydney to discuss the feasibility of establishing a multidisciplinary head and neck cancer society. A working party was formed and following a number of meetings, invitations were sent to individuals in these three specialties to become foundation members of the Australian and New Zealand Head & Neck Cancer Society.

The initial business meeting was held on December 9, 1998 and at that time there were 60 foundation members. The Society adopted as its Constitution the Model Rules for Associations published by the Department of Fair Trading in NSW and the members agreed that their principal objectives would be to promote the practice of head and neck oncology, to educate medical colleagues and the public about our specialty, to foster research and to seek optimal treatment outcomes for our patients.

INVITED SPEAKERS

Keynote Speakers



Professor Alexander Lin – United States

Professor Alexander Lin is the Morton M. Kligerman, MD Endowed Professor of Radiation Oncology, and the Vice Chair of Faculty Affairs at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr Lin leads research programs in personalised approaches in the multidisciplinary treatment of head and neck cancer. Dr Lin leads studies in novel methods of toxicity mitigation in patients with Human Papillomavirus (HPV)-associated cancers of the oropharynx. He also specialises in clinical trials investigating new radiosensitising agents targeting the tumor microenvironment to improve disease outcomes, and in ultra-high dose rate radiotherapy (FLASH), for which he receives funding from the National Cancer Institute (NCI) and National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Dr Lin completed his undergraduate studies at Yale University and his medical and residency training at the University of Michigan prior to joining the faculty at the University of Pennsylvania.



Professor Joanne Patterson – United Kingdom

Professor Jo Patterson is the Chair of Speech & Language Therapy and Associate Dean for Research at School of AHP and Nursing, University of Liverpool, UK.

Jo leads the Survivorship theme for the Liverpool Head and Neck Centre, host to national, and international clinicians and academics, from pre-doctoral to early career researchers, supported by senior academics and the Patient Research Forum. The research programme includes holistic prehabilitation, enhanced recovery, psychosocial adjustment and support models, outcome measure development and novel swallowing intervention development. Jo is a Fellow and Professional Advisor for The Royal College Of Speech & Language Therapists (RCSLT); is the SLT representative on National Institute for Health Research ENT national group, providing strategic direction for AHP research in ENT practice.



Professor Vincent Vander Poorten - Belgium

Professor Vincent Vander Poorten is a Professor and Clinical Head of Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery at University Hospitals Leuven in Belgium. He also serves as the Section Head of Head and Neck Oncology within the Department of Oncology at the Faculty of Medicine, KU Leuven. His clinical interests and expertise are head and neck oncology and surgery, with a specific focus on salivary gland and thyroid surgery, transoral laser microendoscopic and robotic surgery, endoscopic and external approaches to the anterior skull base.

Professor Vander Poorten is a member of the editorial board of the European Journal of Surgical Oncology, Frontiers in Oncology, Frontiers in Surgery, B-ENT and Journal of Head and Neck Physicians and Surgeons. He is also an Executive Board Member of the Asia-Pacific Society of Thyroid Surgery (APTS) and of the Multidisciplinary Salivary Gland Society (MSGS), Vice Chair, International Advisory Section of the American Head and Neck Society – AHNS, Member Executive Committee International Federation of Head and Neck Oncological Societies – IFHNOS.

Professor Danny Rischin – Melbourne

Professor Danny Rischin is a medical oncologist/clinician researcher at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre and Professorial Fellow, Sir Peter MacCallum Department of Oncology, University of Melbourne. He is a National Health and Medical Research Council of Australia Leadership Fellow. From 2007 to 2021 he was the Director of the Department of Medical Oncology at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre and recently completed a 10 year term as an Associate Editor of the Journal of Clinical Oncology.

His major clinical and research interests are in the development of new treatments and novel biomarkers for head and neck cancers and cutaneous squamous cell carcinoma. He has published extensively on these topics (290 publications, 30,000 citations, h-index 76).

He played a major role in the pivotal trials defining the role of immune checkpoint inhibitors in advanced cutaneous SCC and recurrent/metastatic head and neck SCC and continues to have major leadership roles in current potentially practice changing trials.

Chris O'Brien Oration Keynote Speaker



Professor Suren Krishnan - Adelaide

Professor Suren Krishnan is an Otolaryngologist, Head and Neck Surgeon with appointments at Royal Adelaide Hospital and Queen Elizabeth Hospital and in private practice in Adelaide. From 2007 to 2020 he was head of the department and from 2020 to 2022 he was appointed to the position of Medical Lead of Surgical Specialities at the Royal Adelaide Hospital. He is also a Clinical Professor, Faculty of Surgery at the University of Adelaide.

Professor Krishnan was President of the Australian Society of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery (ASOHNS) from 2020 to 2022, an examiner in Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery for the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons and one of the founding members and later a President of the Australian and New Zealand Head and Neck Society.

He has led the introduction of minimally invasive approaches in Head and Neck Surgery, being one of the early adopters of Trans Oral LASER Surgery and the first to perform Trans Oral Robotic Surgery in Australia.

Professor Krishnan has been recognised with Australia Day and Queen's Birthday honours for his services to Head and Neck Surgery and for voluntary medical services to the Pacific Islands, Indonesia and Africa.

Several points require emphasis

- Authors of research papers who wish to have their abstracts considered for inclusion in the program at the ANZHNCS ASM 2025 must submit their abstract electronically via the meeting website adhering to the submission deadline. Abstracts submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
- 2. Abstract submission is entirely online and paper or facsimile copies will not be accepted. Abstracts will not be submitted by meeting staff on behalf of authors.
- 3. The title should be brief and explicit.
- 4. Research papers should follow the format: Purpose, Methodology, Results and Conclusion.

- Abstracts should not exceed 275 words (excluding the title, author(s) and presenters' name). Any references must be included in this allowance. If you exceed this limit, the excess text will NOT appear in the final program.
- 6. Include author(s) and indicate presenting author.
- 7. Include details of main institution.
- 8. Abbreviations should be used only for common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.
- 9. Presentations (slide and video) will only have electronic PowerPoint support. Audio visual instructions will be included in the correspondence sent to all successful authors.
- 10. A 50 word CV is required from each presenter to facilitate their introduction by the session chair.

- 11. The timing (presentation and discussion) of all papers is at the discretion of the organising committee.
- 12. Tables, diagrams, graphs, etc CANNOT be accepted in the abstract submission. This is due to the limitations of the computer software program.
- Please do not type in your abstract onto the submission page. Being internet based, each page on the submission site can only be open for 15 minutes before closing. Type your submission on a text document (eg. Microsoft Word) and copy and paste it into the abstract text field.
- 14. Authors must be registrants at the meeting to present and for their abstract to appear in the final program and on the meeting website.
- 15. Amendments to abstracts after submission is not guaranteed.

The submitting author of an abstract will ALWAYS receive email confirmation of receipt of the abstract into the submission site. If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours it may mean the abstract has not been received. In this circumstance, please email anzhncs.asm@surgeons.org to determine why a confirmation email has not been received.

Important Note Regarding Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interest

ANZHNCS policy requires disclosure of all financial relationships between a speaker and the commercial supporter (if applicable) or with the manufacturer of any product or class of products they plan to discuss. This policy is designed to provide the audience with an opportunity to review any affiliations between a speaker and supporting organisations for the purpose of determining the potential presence of bias or influence over content.

This policy is not intended to prevent a speaker with such an affiliation or relationship from participating.

Disclosure should be made using a slide at the beginning of your presentation.

Examples of relationships which should be disclosed include but are not limited to:

- any direct financial interest in a company whose interests are in the area(s) covered by the educational material
- investments held by the speaker in a relevant company membership on a relevant company's advisory board or similar committee

- current or recent participation in a clinical trial sponsored by a relevant company
- assisting in the design of clinical studies concerning the use of products manufactured by a relevant company
- participating in clinical studies using products produced by a relevant company
- research by the speaker sponsored by a relevant company
- paid speaker by a relevant company
- the speaker holds a patent for a product referred to in the presentation or marketed by a relevant company.

To ensure that audiences receive complete information, speakers who have no involvement with industry should inform the audience that they have nothing to disclose, i.e. cannot identify any potential conflict of interest.

Electronic PowerPoint presentations must be provided to the speaker support staff at the Adelaide Convention Centre. Presentations are required a minimum of 2 hours prior to the commencement of the assigned session.
